Getting into Scripture

Read 1 Corinthians 11:17-34

V17-22

- How can we make sure that nobody would ever have the reason to say that our meetings to more harm than good? Think about Sundays and Lifegroup settings.
- What do you love about your church culture and what would you like to see change?
- Which statement in your opinion is truer, or do you think its equal and why?
 - \circ The church culture influences the society in a positive way.
 - \circ The society influences the culture in church.

V23-26

- The "First Lords Supper" was a part of the Passover meal. Why not having an only Bread & Juice/Wine meal where you spend time reflecting and talking about Jesus'
 - sacrifice...here are some thoughts to stir up the remembrance.
 - \circ Why did God choose the toughest sacrifice?
 - What do you think was going through Jesus' mind when he sat at the table with the disciples?
 - Open a gospel account to reflect on the Jesus' final hours: Luke 22-23, Mathew 26-27
- Have a time of worship where you give thanks!

V27

- Why does Paul mention "...guilty of sinning against the body and blood of the Lord."?

V29-32

- Take some time talking about the discipline and grace. Have you had any experience with feeling that discipline was an act of grace?
