I know I have said this at the beginning of each Life Group Guide this year, but it is because I mean it **THANK YOU** so much for your ongoing commitment to leading an Everyday Church Life Group. In a growing church it is impossible for anyone to know everyone, but it is essential that everyone knows, and is known by someone. That is why what you do in building community is so important and is so valued.

There is a limit to how much we can say in a 30 minute preach on a Sunday. Jesus was very clear in his parable of the wise and foolish builder (Matt 7:24-27), that wisdom comes from both hearing the Word of God and applying it to our lives. Life Groups provide an opportunity to discuss what was taught on a Sunday, but also to hold one another accountable to how we can apply that truth to our lives.

Developing a missional culture

If you were at the ASK meeting on the 19th April, or in Wimbledon on the 16th April you will have seen the graphic below before:

It summarises the spheres that most of us operate within. In each of these spheres there are people deeply loved by God, who are not yet fully aware of that love. Part of our Kingdom calling is to take every opportunity to share God's love and our faith in these spheres. At the ASK prayer meeting I reminded us of a simple model that we can all follow.

Prayer – Praying that God would bless those in our spheres of influence and that God would grow his compassion in our hearts for those around us.

Care – expressing God's unconditional love and compassion to those in our spheres of influence through acts of kindness. Showing a real interest in people, not because they are evangelistic projects, but because God delights in them and wants us to delight in them.

Share – sharing our faith with those who ask us through answering questions with sensitivity, brevity and wisdom.
