

IF – Make You Free

IF - is a conjunction that introduces a conditional statement, meaning "on the condition that". It can also mean "whether" introduce a polite request, or be used to suggest an imaginary situation

(John 8:31-59 nkjv)

- There is a difference between being set free and being made free
- "Setting you free" often refers to an external release from physical or circumstantial bondage.

In context being "set free" is a one-time rescue; you could potentially fall back into old ways.

- "Making you free" implies an internal, transformative change, creating a new nature or state of being

Being "*made* free" by truth (Jesus) means you're remade into a person who inherently lives in freedom, a deeper, lasting change from guilt and sin, not just circumstances.

- Being made free is conditional.
 1. First you must believe in him (Jesus)
 2. You must be a disciple, and a disciple is someone who abides in his Word
- The word **Abide**, biblically means – **to remain, stay, dwell or be held firmly connected to Jesus**

- If you abide in God's word you will know the truth, and the truth shall make you free
- It will begin to change you from the inside out. You'll become a new creation
- Knowing truth makes you free. Jesus said that he is the truth. So when scriptures says if the son makes you free your free indeed. It's because you're conforming into the image of the son, who is the truth and truth makes you free **(Romans 8:29-30 nkjv)**
- Conforming into the image of the son. Is letting God transform you into a new person by changing the way you think **(Romans 12:1-2 nlt)**
- You can't know the truths about God that makes you free without the Holy Spirit, and anyone with the Holy Spirit has the mind of Christ **(1Corinthians 2:11-16 nlt)**
- The Law of the Spirit of life in Christ Jesus has made us free from the law of sin and death **(Romans 8:1-11 nkjv)**
- Because Christ has made you free. Make sure that you stay free and don't get tied up into bondage again **(Galatians 5:1-26 nkjv)**
- When you produce much fruit. You are truly his disciple, and it brings great glory to the father **(John 15:5-8 nlt)**
