BIG IDEA

*Salvation is rooted in the grace
and power of a glorious God.*

Exodus 13:3-6

[3] Then Moses said to the people,
“**Remember this day** in which you came out from Egypt, out of the house of slavery, **for** by a strong hand the LORD brought you out from this place. No leavened bread shall be eaten. [4] Today, in the month of Abib, you are going out.

Exodus 13:3-6

[5] And when the LORD brings you into the land of the Canaanites, the Hittites, the Amorites, the Hivites, and the Jebusites, which he swore to your fathers to give you, a land flowing with milk and honey, you shall keep this service in this month.

[6] Seven days you shall eat unleavened bread, and on the seventh day there shall be a feast to the LORD.

Exodus 13:3-6

[3] Then Moses said to the people,
“**Remember this day** in which you came out from Egypt, out of the house of slavery, **for by a strong hand the LORD brought you out from this place**. No leavened bread shall be eaten. [4] Today, in the month of Abib, you are going out.


Exodus 13:8-9

'It is because of what the LORD did for me when I came out of Egypt.' And it shall be to you as a sign on your hand and as a memorial between your eyes, that the law of the LORD may be in your mouth. ***For with a strong hand the LORD has brought you out of Egypt.***



Exodus 13:14-15

[14] And when in time to come your son asks you, 'What does this mean?' you shall say to him, '**By a strong hand the LORD brought us out of Egypt, from the house of slavery.** [15] For when Pharaoh stubbornly refused to let us go, the LORD killed all the firstborn in the land of Egypt, both the firstborn of man and the firstborn of animals. Therefore I sacrifice to the LORD all the males that first open the womb, but all the firstborn of my sons I redeem.'

Exodus 13:17-21

[17] When Pharaoh let the people go, God did not lead them by way of the land of the Philistines, although that was near. For God said, “Lest the people change their minds when they see war and return to Egypt.”

Exodus 13:17-21

[18] But God led the people around by the way of the wilderness toward the Red Sea...

[21] And the LORD went before them by day in a pillar of cloud to lead them along the way, and by night in a pillar of fire to give them light, that they might travel by day and by night.



Exodus 14:2-4

[2] “Tell the people of Israel to turn back and encamp in front of Pi-hahiroth, between Migdol and the sea, in front of Baal-zephon; you shall encamp facing it, by the sea. [3] For Pharaoh will say of the people of Israel, ‘They are wandering in the land; the wilderness has shut them in.’ [4] And I will harden Pharaoh’s heart, and he will pursue them, and I will get glory over Pharaoh and all his host, and the Egyptians shall know that I am the LORD...



Key Principle #2

We can trust God's direction in our life because He sees the big picture and knows what is best, even when we do not.

Exodus 14:10-12

[10] When Pharaoh drew near, the people of Israel lifted up their eyes, and behold, the Egyptians were marching after them, and they feared greatly. And the people of Israel cried out to the LORD. [11] They said to Moses, "Is it because there are no graves in Egypt that you have taken us away to die in the wilderness?"

Exodus 14:10-12

What have you done to us in bringing us out of Egypt? [12] Is not this what we said to you in Egypt: 'Leave us alone that we may serve the Egyptians'? For it would have been better for us to serve the Egyptians than to die in the wilderness."

Exodus 14:13-14


[13] And Moses said to the people, “Fear not, stand firm, and see the salvation of the LORD, which he will work for you today. For the Egyptians whom you see today, you shall never see again. [14] The LORD will fight for you, and you have only to be silent.”



Exodus 14:30-31

[30] Thus the LORD saved Israel that day *from the hand of the Egyptians*, and Israel saw the Egyptians dead on the seashore.

[31] **Israel saw the great power that the LORD used against the Egyptians**, so the people feared the LORD, and they believed in the LORD and in his servant Moses.




Parting of Red Sea
