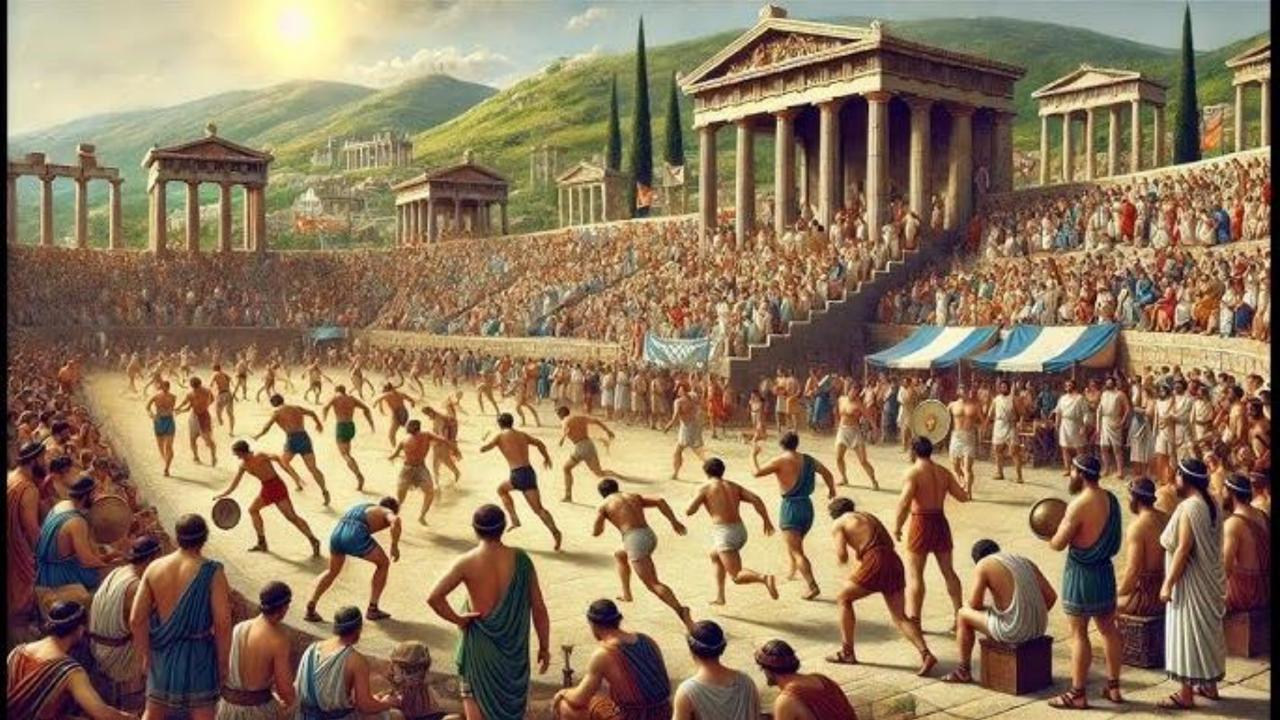
Jesus is Better

BOOK OF HEBREWS

1 Corinthians 9:24-27

[24] Do you not know that in a race all the runners run, but only one receives the prize? So run that you may obtain it. [25] Every athlete exercises selfcontrol in all things. They do it to receive a perishable wreath, but we an imperishable. [26] So I do not run aimlessly; I do not box as one beating the air. [27] But I discipline my body and keep it under control, lest after preaching to others I myself should be disqualified.











"In sport, particularly long-distance running, the placement of one's vision makes a considerable difference. Looking at a close point will result in dizziness and imbalance, and looking too far away makes the road seem impossibly long. A midway distance offers the right perspective, and that is easiest to maintain if a runner has a person on whom to set their vision. Often runners are given the mental trick of fixing their sight on a person in that appropriate distance and imagining that they are attached to that person by a rope that pulls them along. That person's momentum becomes one's own."
