DECEIVED IN THE GARDEN

BIBLE BASIS:

Genesis 1-3

KEY VERSE:

"But God demonstrates his own love for us in this: While we were still sinners, Christ died for us." (Romans 5:8 NIV)



BIG IDEA:

God's love is greater than our sin.

5AM PRAYER NOTES

SERMON NOTES

SMALL GROUP GUIDE

OPENING QUESTION:

Can you think of a time you were tricked or deceived by something or someone? How did it make you feel?

KEY SCRIPTURE:

- Genesis 1–3
- · Romans 5:8
- Genesis 3:15
- Romans 5:12, 17
- Revelation 22:2

MAIN POINTS:

- Sin broke our relationship with God—but it didn't break His love for us
- 2. God's plan for redemption began in the garden—grace was always in motion.
- 3. Jesus is the cure—He came not to make bad people good, but to make dead people alive.

DISCUSSION QUESTION:

- 1. When have you tried to hide from God or "fix" your mistakes on your own, like Adam and Eve with fig leaves?
- 2. Read Genesis 3:1-6. How did the serpent's deception work? What can we learn about how sin operates today?
- 3. Romans 5:8 says Christ died for us "while we were still sinners." How does that shape your view of God's love and grace?
- 4. In what area of your life do you need to stop believing the lies of the enemy and start trusting in the truth of the cross?
- 5. What does it mean for you personally to "walk in redemption"? How can you live differently knowing you're loved even at your worst?

KEY TAKEAWAYS:

- 1. The enemy uses subtle lies to draw us away from God—just like in the garden.
- 2. God was not surprised by sin; He had a redemption plan from the beginning.
- 3. Jesus fulfilled the promise in Genesis 3—He crushed the serpent and opened the way back to life.
- 4. True change starts when we stop hiding and let God cover us with His grace.
- 5. We are not defined by our sin—we are defined by God's love through Jesus.

Fasting Take a prayer walk. Use this time to observe creation and praise God

Theme Our Need for Redemption

Prayer

Focus
Repent of areas of disobedience and receive God's mercy.

Fasting Use your meal time to journal a confession prayer or read Psalm 51

Focus slowly and reflectively.

DAY 3 - AUGUST 6

Reading Genesis 5-6

Theme Walking with God in a Corrupt World

Prayer Focus

Ask God for the courage to walk faithfully like Noah in today's culture.

Fasting Read aloud a chapter from Proverbs or Matthew during your normal

Focus meal time.

DAY 4 - AUGUST 7

Reading Genesis 7-8

Theme Hope in the Storm

Prayer

Focus
Thank God for His faithfulness through difficult seasons.

Fasting Spend time in worship. Sing or listen to songs that declare God's

Focus faithfulness.

DAY 5 - AUGUST 8

Reading Genesis 9–10

Theme God of Covenant Promises

Prayer Praise God for His promises and pray intentionally for your family

Focus and generations to come.

Fasting Use the time to write down and memorize key Scripture promises

Focus from God's Word.

DAY 6 - AUGUST 9

Reading Genesis 11:1-26

Theme Surrendering Pride to Seek God's Will

Prayer Ask God to align your dreams with His will and to remove all selfish

Focus ambition.

Fasting Sit in silence before the Lord. Listen more than you speak during

Focus your prayer time today.

COVENANT WITH NOAH

BIBLE BASIS:

Genesis 7:1-9:17

KEY VERSE:

"The grass withers and the flowers fall, but the word of our God endures forever." (Isaiah 40:8)



BIG IDEA:

God is a promise keeper, so we can trust that His promises will last forever.

5 AM PRAYER NOTES	

SERMON NOTES

SMALL GROUP GUIDE

OPENING QUESTION:

Have you ever experienced a season in life where it felt like everything around you was "flooding"—stress, failure, pain, or confusion? What helped you stay afloat during that time?

KEY SCRIPTURE:

- Genesis 7:1–9:17
- Romans 6:23
- 1 Peter 3:20-21
- 2 Corinthians 5:17
- 2 Peter 3:9

MAIN POINTS:

- God Judges Sin The flood demonstrates God's holiness and justice in response to human sin.
- 2. God Saves Through Grace Noah's story is an early picture of God's saving grace, fulfilled ultimately in Jesus.
- 3. God Keeps His Promises The rainbow is a symbol of God's lasting covenant, pointing us to the eternal promise in Christ.

DISCUSSION QUESTION:

- 1. Personal Application: What area of your life feels like a flood right now, and where do you need to trust God's promise today?
- 2. Scripture Understanding: How does the story of Noah help us better understand both God's justice and His mercy? (See Genesis 7:1–9:17 and 1 Peter 3:20–21)
- 3. Practical Implementation: Noah obeyed even when his obedience seemed illogical (Genesis 7:5). What does faithful obedience look like in your current season of life?
- **4. Group Reflection:** "But God remembered Noah..." (Genesis 8:1). Share a time you felt "remembered by God" even when your situation didn't immediately change.
- 5. Challenge/Growth: Genesis 9 shows God offering a new beginning. What is something old you need to leave behind, and what "new beginning" is God inviting you into?

KEY TAKEAWAYS:

- 1. Faith sometimes looks ridiculous before it looks miraculous—obey even when it doesn't make sense.
- 2. Waiting doesn't mean God has forgotten you—He remembers His people and His promises.
- 3. Jesus is the ark—rescuing us from judgment and bringing us safely to new life.
- 4. The rainbow reminds us of God's covenant faithfulness—past, present, and future.
- 5. In Christ, you are a new creation—step out of survival mode and into your renewed purpose.

Theme Living with Open Hands

Prayer

Focus Pray for contentment and generosity in uncertain circumstances.

Fasting Spend your fast time praying for those in need around you

Focus or globally.

DAY 10 - AUGUST 13

Reading Genesis 15-16

Theme Trusting in Seasons of Delay

Prayer Focus

Ask the Lord for patience and peace to wait on His promises.

Fasting Reflect on previous seasons where God answered after waiting.

Focus Record a short testimony.

DAY 11 - AUGUST 14

Reading Genesis 17-18

Theme Marked by the Covenant

Prayer Focus

Recommit every area of your life to God's covenant and Lordship.

Fasting

Speak Scriptures of identity (Galatians 3, Romans 8) over yourself

Focus and your household.

DAY 12 - AUGUST 15

Reading Genesis 19-20

Theme Standing in the Gap

Prayer Intercede for the salvation and protection of your city, nation, and

Focus loved ones.

Fasting Build a prayer list of people and places on your heart and cover

Focus them in extended prayer.

DAY 13 - AUGUST 16

Reading Genesis 21–22

Theme Faith in the Testing

Prayer Focus

Ask for the faith to obey even when the sacrifice is great.

Fasting Meditate on Genesis 22 during your fast window. Write down what

Focus God may be asking you to surrender.

THE TOWER OF BABEL

BIBLE BASIS:

Genesis 11:1-9

KEY VERSE:

"Many are the plans in a person's heart, but it is the Lord's purpose that prevails." (Proverbs 19:21)



BIG IDEA:

God's plans are unstoppable and I can trust that they are good for my life.

5 AM PRAYER NOTES	

SERMON NOTES

SMALL GROUP GUIDE

OPENING QUESTION:

What is something you're currently working on or building in your life (a goal, a relationship, a project)? How are you approaching it—solo or with God's help?

KEY SCRIPTURE:

- Genesis 11:1–9
- Proverbs 19:21
- Zechariah 4:6
- Philippians 2:9

MAIN POINTS:

- 1. Build with God's purpose, not just your plans.
- 2. Depend on God's power, not your own strength.
- 3. Live for God's name, not your own.

DISCUSSION QUESTION:

- 1. Personal Application: Where in your life have you been tempted to "make a name for yourself" instead of honoring God's name?
- 2. Scripture Understanding: In Genesis 11:4, the people desired to build a tower that reached the heavens. What was wrong with their motivation? How does this relate to pride and self-glory?
- **3. Practical Implementation:** How can you shift your daily routines (work, family, relationships) to reflect God's purpose and strength rather than your own?
- **4. Group Reflection:** Can anyone in the group share a time when they tried to build something without God, and what happened? What changed when they let God take the lead?
- **5.** Challenge/Growth: What's one area in your life right now that needs to be surrendered to God's blueprint instead of your own design?

KEY TAKEAWAYS:

- 1. Ambition without God's direction leads to collapse.
- 2. God's purpose always prevails over our best plans.
- 3. Relying on your own strength leads to burnout, but God's Spirit provides true power.
- 4. Living for God's name brings clarity and longterm peace.
- 5. Jesus redeems and rebuilds where pride has caused confusion.

Theme God Works Through Brokenness

Prayer

Focus Trust God to bring fruit from painful or frustrating seasons.

Fasting Pray specifically for healing and purpose in confusing relationships

Focus or situations.

DAY 20 - AUGUST 23

Reading Genesis 33–34

Theme Choosing Forgiveness and Healing

Prayer Focus

Pray for the strength to forgive fully and pursue relational restoration.

Fasting Write a letter of forgiveness—whether shared or not—and release

Focus the offense to God.

GOD'S COVENANT WITH ABRAHAM

BIBLE BASIS:

Genesis 12:1-9; 15; Hebrews 11:8-16

KEY VERSE:

"Now faith is confidence in what we hope for and assurance about what we do not see." (Hebrews 11:1)



BIG IDEA:

God is real and His promises are true, so we can have faith in Him even though we can't see Him.

5 AM PRAYER NOTES	

SERMON NOTES

SMALL GROUP GUIDE

OPENING QUESTION:

Have you ever felt like God was prompting you to do something without giving you the full picture? How did it make you feel, and what did you do?

KEY SCRIPTURE:

- Genesis 12:1-3
- Genesis 15:5-6
- Hebrews 11:8, 13, 16

MAIN POINTS:

- Abraham responded to God's call without having a complete plan—he trusted God's promise over his own understanding.
- 2. Faith means believing God's promises even when they are delayed or not fully seen.
- 3. Living by faith includes having an eternal perspective, looking ahead to God's heavenly kingdom over earthly comfort.

DISCUSSION QUESTION:

- 1. Personal Application: In what area of your life do you feel God is calling you to trust Him without all the details?
- 2. Scripture Understanding: Read Genesis 12:1–3. What stands out to you about God's call and promise to Abraham? Why is this significant?
- 3. Practical Implementation: How can you choose to obey God this week even if you don't have clarity about the outcome?
- **4. Group Reflection:** As a group, how can we encourage each other to walk by faith when God's promises feel delayed or distant?
- 5. Challenge/Growth: What is one step of obedience you need to take right now that might stretch your faith? What's holding you back?

KEY TAKEAWAYS:

- Faith isn't about having clarity; it's about having confidence in God.
- 2. Obedience often comes before full understanding.
- 3. God's promises may be delayed but are never denied.
- 4. Living with eternity in mind shapes how we live today.
- 5. God is honored and walks with those who walk by faith.

God desires that we humbly put others before ourselves.

SERMON NOTES

SMALL GROUP GUIDE

OPENING QUESTION:

Can you think of a time when you had to choose between what looked good and what you sensed God was asking of you? What did you learn from that experience?

KEY SCRIPTURE:

- Genesis 13:2, 6-11, 14-15
- Romans 12:18
- Proverbs 14:12
- Galatians 6:9

MAIN POINTS:

- 1. Prioritize relationships over being right.
- 2. Let God lead your decisions, not just your eyes.
- 3. Trust God to bless your surrender, not your striving.

DISCUSSION QUESTION:

- 1. Personal Application: Is there a current conflict or choice you're facing where God may be calling you to choose peace over position? What's holding you back from surrendering it to Him?
- **2. Scripture Understanding:** Compare Lot and Abram's decision-making approaches in Genesis 13. What does their contrast teach us about faith and trust?
- **3. Practical Implementation:** How can you apply the principle of "seeking, not scanning" in a current decision you're trying to make?
- **4. Group Reflection:** Think of a time when striving led to stress, but surrender brought peace. What did that teach you about God's character?
- 5. Challenge/Growth: What is one area in your life where you've been trying to take control, and God is asking you to let go? What step of faith can you take this week to release it?

KEY TAKEAWAYS:

- Conflict often reveals our heart—choose peace, not pride.
- 2. God's best doesn't always look like the world's best.
- 3. Humility and surrender position us for God's provision.
- 4. Faith means trusting in God's promise rather than pushing for position.
- 5. You never lose when you choose God's way over what looks good.
