THE JUDGES: DEBORAH

Joshua 24:14 (NIV)

"Now fear the LORD and serve him with all faithfulness."

ISRAEL'S REAL BATTLE IS MORE

Ephesians 6:12 (NIV)

"For our struggle is not against flesh and blood, but... against the spiritual forces of evil in the heavenly realms."

Judges 4:4 (NIV)

Deborah was "a prophet, the wife of Lappidoth, [who] was leading Israel at that time".

Judges 4:5 (NIV)

She held court "under the Palm of Deborah between Ramah and Bethel in the hill country of Ephraim, and the Israelites went up to her to have their disputes decided".

Judges 4:3 (NIV)

The Israelites were being cruelly oppressed by Jabin, king of Canaan, and his commander Sisera, for twenty years until "the Israelites cried to the LORD for help".

Judges 4:6-7 (NIV)

Deborah summoned Barak and said to him, "The LORD, the God of Israel, commands you: 'Go, take with you ten thousand men of Naphtali and Zebulun... I will lead Sisera... into your hands'".

Judges 4:9 (NIV)

When Barak hesitated, Deborah replied, "Certainly I will go with you... But because of the course you are taking, the honor will not be yours, for the LORD will deliver Sisera into the hands of a woman".

Judges 4:21 (NIV)

At her word, Barak led an army that defeated Sisera's forces. Sisera fled and was killed by Jael, fulfilling Deborah's prophecy.

Judges 5:1, 3 (NIV)

Then "on that day Deborah and Barak son of Abinoam sang this song: 'I will sing to the LORD, I will sing; I will make music to the LORD, the God of Israel!'"

Judges 5:31 (NIV)

Afterward, "the land had peace forty years."
