





12 SERIES: POINT



The difference between judgment and assessment depends on the heart of the person doing the action.

- Judgement is condemnation without compassion.
- Assessment is wisdom with empathy.
- Judgement criticizes with self-righteousness and relational distance.
- Assessment evaluates with humility and relational proximity.
