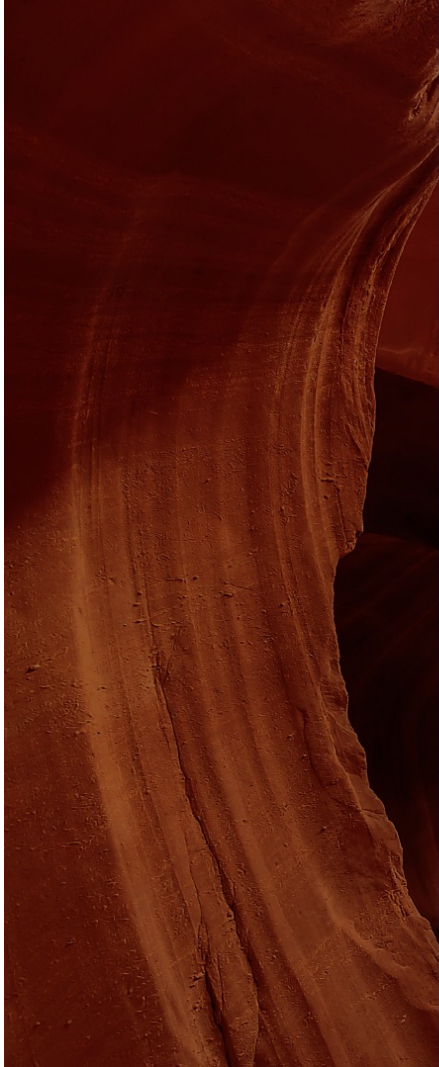

Envy blinds us to our own blessings.



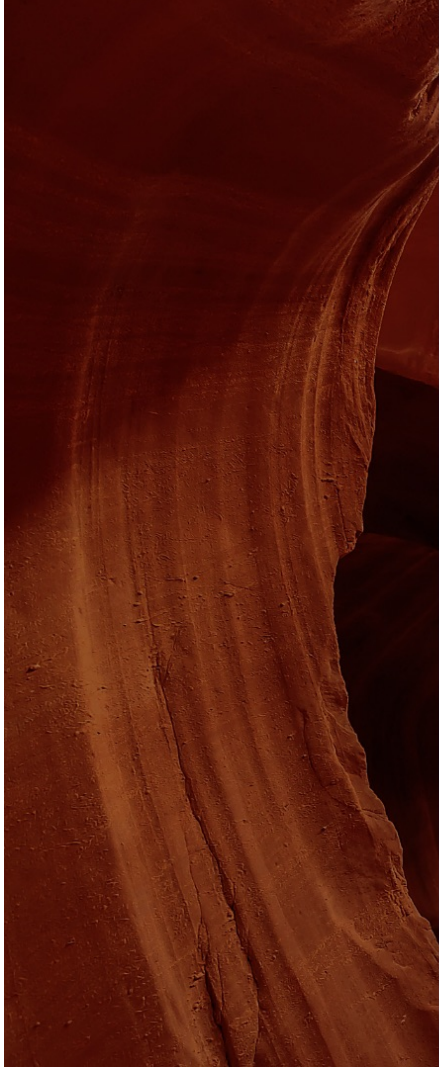
**The question is not:
