Humble Prayer

Luke 18:9-14

Luke 18:1: Then He spoke a parable to them, that men always ought to pray and not lose heart (cowardly, faint, lose heart, and give up.)

Luke 18:9: Also He spoke this **parable** to **some** who **trusted in themselves** that they were **righteous**, and **despised others**:

To <u>trust in yourself</u> to be <u>righteous</u> is to be <u>self-righteous</u>

Paul was a Pharisee

What happened to Paul?

Isaiah 64:6: But we are <u>all</u> like an <u>unclean</u> thing, and <u>all</u> <u>our righteousnesses</u> are like <u>filthy rags</u>;

Romans 3:19: Now we know that whatever the <u>law</u> says, it says ...that <u>every mouth may be stopped</u>, and <u>all the</u> <u>world</u> may become <u>guilty</u> before God.

Galatians 3:24: Therefore the <u>law</u> was our <u>tutor</u> to <u>bring</u> <u>us to Christ</u>, that we might be <u>justified</u> by <u>faith</u>.

Luke 18:9: Also He spoke this **parable** to some **who trusted in themselves** that they were **righteous**, and **despised others**:

Luke 18:10: <u>Two men</u> went up to the <u>temple</u> to <u>pray</u>, one a <u>Pharisee</u> and the other a <u>tax collector</u>.

Matthew 5:20: For <u>I say to you</u>, that unless your <u>righteousness</u> exceeds the <u>righteousness</u> of the <u>scribes</u> and <u>Pharisees</u>, you will by <u>no means enter</u> the kingdom of heaven.

Matthew 5:48: Therefore you shall be **perfect**, just as your Father in heaven is **perfect**.

Are you **perfect**?

1 Timothy 1:15: This is a faithful <u>saying</u> and <u>worthy</u> of <u>all</u> <u>acceptance</u>, that <u>Christ Jesus</u> came into the world to save <u>sinners</u>, of whom I am <u>chief</u>.

Luke 18:11: The <u>Pharisee stood</u> and <u>prayed thus with</u> <u>himself</u>, "God, <u>I</u> thank You that <u>I</u> am <u>not</u> like <u>other men</u> - <u>extortioners</u> (robbers), <u>unjust</u>, <u>adulterers</u>, or even as this tax collector."

The **Pharisees** were **not** <u>righteous</u> but <u>they didn't</u> **know it**.

Luke 18:12: <u>I fast</u> twice a week; <u>I</u> give <u>tithes</u> of all that <u>I</u> possess.

SIn and Pride

Praying, fasting, tithing doesn't make us righteous!
When you fast not If you fast!

Abraham, Jacob <—**Law**—> Jesus

Luke 18:13: And the tax collector, <u>standing afar off</u>, would not so much <u>as raise his eyes to heaven</u>, but <u>beat</u>

his breast, saying, "God, be merciful (propitious) to me a
sinner!"

He stood afar off

He would not <u>raise his eyes to heaven</u>

He **beat his breast** (kept beating)

God — be propitious — Me — the — sinner

Luke 18:14: I tell you, this man went down to his house **justified rather** than the **other**; for everyone who **exalts** himself will be **humbled**, and he who **humbles** himself will be **exalted**.

It's this <u>humble prayer</u> ... that led to this <u>sinful</u> man being <u>justified!</u>

Fulfilled in Jesus!

1 John 2:2: And <u>He Himself</u> is the <u>propitiation</u> for <u>our</u> <u>sins</u>, and not for ours only but also for the <u>whole world</u>.

1 Corinthians 6:9-11: Do you not know that the unrighteous will not inherit the kingdom of God? Do not be deceived. Neither fornicators, nor idolaters, nor adulterers, nor homosexuals, nor sodomites, nor thieves, nor covetous, nor drunkards, nor revilers, nor extortioners will inherit the kingdom of God. And such were some of you. But you were washed, but you were sanctified, but you were justified in the name of the Lord Jesus and by the Spirit of our God.
