The Boy Jesus Luke 2:41-52

• The Birth of Jesus • The Child Jesus • <u>The Boy Jesus</u>

Luke 2:40: And the <u>Child</u> grew and became <u>strong in spirit</u>, <u>filled with wisdom</u>; and the <u>grace of God was upon Him</u>.

Luke 2:41: His <u>parents</u> went to <u>Jerusalem</u> <u>every year</u> at the <u>Feast</u> of the <u>Passover</u>.

Joseph and Mary were faithful Jewish parent living in obedience to the Scriptures.

<u>Passover</u> is the oldest continually celebrated feast in the world.

Jesus is our Passover and was sacrificed for us! (1 Corinthians 5:7)

Luke 2:42: And when He was <u>twelve years old</u>, they went <u>up</u> to <u>Jerusalem</u> according to the custom of the feast.

At <u>twelve years old</u>, a Jewish boy would begin to learn his <u>father's</u> trade. Jesus was known as "the carpenters son."

Luke 2:43: When they had finished the <u>days</u>, as they returned, the <u>Boy Jesus</u> lingered behind in Jerusalem. And <u>Joseph and His mother</u> did not know it.

In verse 41 Joseph and Mary are called Jesus' <u>parents</u>. Here Luke refers to them as <u>Joseph and His mother</u>.

Luke 2:44: But supposing Him to have been in <u>the company</u>, they went a <u>day's</u> journey, and sought Him among their <u>relatives</u> and <u>acquaintances</u>.

Luke 2:45-46: So when they did not find Him, they returned to Jerusalem, seeking Him. Now so it was that after <u>three days</u> they found Him in the <u>temple</u>, <u>sitting</u> in the <u>midst</u> of the teachers, both listening to them and asking them questions.

Prophetically, this is why Jesus came - as our great High Priest.

Jesus is the **fulfillment** of the <u>temple</u>.

Luke 2:47: And all who heard Him were astonished at His <u>understanding</u> and <u>answers</u>.

That's who Jesus is: He <u>understands</u> and <u>answers</u>.

Luke 2:48: So when they saw Him, they were amazed; and His mother said to Him, "Son, why have You done this to us? <u>Look</u>, Your <u>father and I</u> have sought You <u>anxiously</u>."

<u>Anxiously</u> - Distressed, tormented, agony

Luke 2:49: And He said to them, "Why did you seek Me? Did you not <u>know</u> [see] that I <u>must</u> be about <u>My Father's business</u>?"

My Father (v. 49) is in **contrast** to your father in v. 48.

Luke 2:50: But they did not understand the statement which He spoke to them.

- We who have the Scriptures understand.
- Do **you** understand?

Luke 2:51-52: Then He went <u>down</u> with them and came to Nazareth, and was <u>subject</u> to <u>them</u>, but His <u>mother kept all these things in her heart.</u> And Jesus <u>increased</u> in <u>wisdom</u> and <u>stature</u>, and in <u>favor with God</u> and <u>men</u>.

Jesus was <u>subject</u> (obedient) to His <u>parents</u>, to Mary His mother and to Joseph His earthly adoptive father.

Jesus is our **example**:

- baptism
- great commission
- serving others

- Father's business (our text)
- subject (obedient) to His parents

Why is **obedience** to parents so **core** to the Scriptures?

Deuteronomy 21:18 - stubborn and rebellious son

Two tablets of the Law - Christian and Jewish views.

Jesus was not only <u>subject</u> to Joseph and His mother but He we also find Him subject to His <u>Heavenly Father</u>.
