The Lost Sheep

Luke 15:1-7

Luke 14:35: He who has <u>ears to hear</u>, let him hear! (Spirit)

Luke 15:1: <u>Then</u> all the <u>tax collectors</u> and the <u>sinners</u> [notorious and especially wicked, habitual] <u>drew near to</u> <u>Him</u> to <u>hear Him</u>.

Luke 15:2: And the **Pharisees** and **scribes complained** saying, "This Man **receives sinners** and **eats** with them."

Luke 15:3: So He spoke this **parable** to them, saying:

Luke 15:4: "What man of you, having a hundred <u>sheep</u>, if he loses <u>one</u> of them, does not leave the ninety-nine in the wilderness, and <u>go after</u> the <u>one</u> which is lost <u>until he</u> <u>finds it</u>?"

Isaiah 53:6: All <u>we like sheep</u> have <u>gone astray</u>; We have turned, every <u>one</u>, to his own way;

John 20:21: As the Father has sent Me, I also send you.

Luke 15:5: And when he has **found it**, he **lays it** on his shoulders, **rejoicing**.

Isaiah 62:5: As the <u>bridegroom rejoices</u> over the <u>bride</u>, so shall <u>your God rejoice</u> over <u>you</u>.

Zephaniah 3:17: "The Lord your God in your midst, the Mighty One, will <u>save</u>; He will <u>rejoice over you with</u>

gladness, He will quiet you with His love, He will rejoice over you with singing."

Luke 15:6: And when he comes home, he calls together his friends and neighbors, saying to them, 'Rejoice with me, for I have **found** my sheep which was **lost**!'

Luke 15:7: I say to you that <u>likewise</u> there will be more **joy in heaven** over **one sinner** who **repents** than over **ninety-nine just persons** who **need no repentance**.

Luke 5:31-32: Those who are <u>well</u> have no need of a <u>physician</u>, but those who are <u>sick</u>. I have not come to call the righteous, but <u>sinners</u>, to <u>repentance</u>.

Luke 16:15: You are those who justify yourselves before men, but God knows your hearts.

Luke 18:9: He spoke this **parable** to some who **trusted in themselves** that they were **righteous**, despised others.

Luke 18:10-14: "Two men went up to the temple to pray, one a Pharisee and the other a tax collector. The Pharisee stood and prayed thus with himself, 'God, I thank You that I am not like other men - extortioners, unjust, adulterers, or even as this tax collector. I fast twice a week; I give tithes of all that I possess.' And the tax collector, standing afar off, would not so much as raise his eyes to heaven, but beat his breast, saying, 'God, be merciful to me a sinner!' I tell you, this man went down to his house justified rather than the other; for everyone who exalts

himself will be humbled, and he who humbles himself will be exalted."

Mark 1:15: The time is fulfilled, and the <u>kingdom of God</u> is <u>at hand</u>. <u>Repent</u>, and <u>believe</u> in the <u>gospel</u>.
