## The New and The Old

Luke 5:36-39

Luke 5:36-39: Then He spoke a parable to them: "No one puts a piece from a <u>new</u> garment on an <u>old</u> one; otherwise the <u>new</u> makes a tear, and also the piece that was taken out of the <u>new</u> does not match the <u>old</u>. And no one puts <u>new</u> wine into <u>old</u> wineskins; or else the <u>new</u> wine will burst the wineskins and be spilled, and the wineskins will be ruined. But <u>new</u> wine must be put into <u>new</u> wineskins, and both are preserved. And no one, having drunk <u>old</u> wine, immediately desires <u>new</u>; for he says, '<u>The</u> <u>old is better</u>.'"

The **new** speaks of the **New Covenant**! **New garments**, **new wine**, a **new** work of the **Spirit**!

The **<u>old</u>** speaks of the <u>**Old Covenant**</u> that is portrayed by an <u>**old**</u> worn out **<u>garment</u>**, and an <u>**old wineskin**</u>!

Luke 5:36: <u>Then</u> He spoke a parable to them:

Luke 19:10: The <u>Son of Man</u> has come to <u>seek and to save</u> that which was <u>lost</u>.

**1 Timothy 1:15:** This is a faithful saying and <u>worthy</u> of <u>all acceptance</u>, that Christ Jesus came into the world <u>to save sinners</u>

1 John 3:16: By this we know love, because <u>He laid down His life for us</u>.

Luke 5:36: <u>Then</u> He spoke a <u>parable</u> to them: "No one puts <u>a piece</u> from a <u>new garment</u> on an <u>old</u> one; otherwise the <u>new</u> makes a <u>tear</u>, and also the <u>piece</u> that was taken out of the <u>new</u> does not <u>match</u> the <u>old</u>.

Jesus did **not** come to **<u>patch up</u>** Judaism.

Jesus came to usher in a completely <u>new</u> work of God. <u>New</u> <u>garments</u> of salvation. <u>A New Covenant</u>! **Genesis 1:21:** Also for Adam and his wife the Lord God made <u>tunics of</u> <u>skin</u>, and <u>clothed</u> them.

Matthew 26:27-28: Then He took <u>the cup</u>, and gave thanks, and gave it to them, saying, "Drink from it, <u>all of you</u>. For this is <u>My blood</u> of the <u>new covenant</u>, which is shed for <u>many</u> for the <u>forgiveness of sins</u>.

**Ezekiel 36:26-27:** And I will give you a <u>new heart</u>, and I will put a <u>new</u> <u>spirit</u> in you. I will take out your <u>stony</u>, <u>stubborn heart</u> and give you a <u>tender</u>, <u>responsive heart</u>. And I will put my <u>Spirit</u> in you so that you will follow my decrees and be careful to obey my regulations.

Luke 5:37-38: And no one puts <u>new</u> wine into <u>old</u> wineskins; or else the <u>new</u> wine will burst the wineskins and be spilled, and the wineskins will be ruined. But <u>new</u> wine must be put into <u>new</u> wineskins, and both are preserved.

## New wine is expansive!

<u>Old wineskins</u> lose their <u>elasticity</u>, their capacity to <u>stretch</u>, to <u>expand</u> to <u>flex</u> with the <u>new wine</u>!

Branch - The root word means tender and flexible

**New wine** is **expansive**! So is the **New Covenant**!

Mark 16:15: <u>Go</u> into <u>all the world</u> and preach the gospel to <u>every</u> <u>creature</u>

Acts 1:8: But you shall receive <u>power</u> when the <u>Holy Spirit</u> has come upon you; and you shall be <u>witnesses</u> to Me in <u>Jerusalem</u>, and in all <u>Judea</u> and <u>Samaria</u>, and to the <u>end of the earth</u>."

**Luke 5:39:** And no one, having drunk <u>old wine</u>, immediately desires <u>new</u>; for he says, '<u>The old is better</u>.'

The Jewish leaders were **not** open to the <u>**new**</u>! They were convinced that the <u>**old covenant**</u> was better!

Hebrews 8:6: But now <u>Jesus</u> is <u>Mediator</u> of a <u>better covenant</u>, which was established on <u>better promises</u>.

The **<u>Old Covenant</u>** was **external**, the conditions of the covenant being written upon tablets of <u>stone</u>

The **<u>New Covenant</u>** is **internal**, written by the Holy Spirit on the tablets of our <u>**heart**</u>

The **<u>Old Covenant</u>** was based upon the people <u>**keeping**</u> God's commandments

The <u>New Covenant</u> is based <u>not</u> upon <u>us</u> doing but upon what God has **done** <u>for us</u>. God became a Man and did <u>for us</u> what we could **not** do for ourselves.

The **<u>Old Covenant</u>** was ratified by the <u>**blood**</u> of <u>**bulls**</u> and <u>**goats**</u>, <u>**year after year!**</u>

The **New Covenant** was ratified by the **blood** of **Jesus**, **once for all**!

The **<u>Old Covenant</u>** brought a **<u>covering</u>** for mans sins!

The **New Covenant** brings **forgiveness** of sins!

**Ezekiel 36:26-27:** And I will give you a <u>new heart</u>, and I will put a <u>new</u> <u>spirit</u> in you. I will take out your <u>stony</u>, <u>stubborn heart</u> and give you a <u>tender</u>, <u>responsive heart</u>. And I will put my <u>Spirit</u> in you so that you will follow my decrees and be careful to obey my regulations.

**Revelation 1:5:** <u>To Him</u> who <u>loved us</u> and <u>washed us</u> from our <u>sins</u> in His own <u>blood</u>
