## A Church That Changed The World! Acts 13:1-3

**Acts 13:1:** Now in the <u>church</u> that was at <u>Antioch</u> there were certain prophets and teachers:

church: Greek - Ekklesia <u>Called out ones</u>

Acts 11:21: And the <u>hand of the Lord</u> was with them, and a great number <u>believed</u> and <u>turned to the Lord</u>.

Acts 13:1: Now in the church that was at Antioch there were certain **prophets** and **teachers**:

<u>**Prophets</u>** are those who by the Holy Spirit, help **<u>guide</u>** the <u>church</u> as they speak the <u>Heart</u> of <u>God</u>.</u>

<u>Teachers</u> are those who help <u>ground</u> and <u>equip</u> the <u>church</u> as they <u>teach</u> the <u>Word</u> of <u>God.</u>

Acts 13:1: Now in the church that was at Antioch there were certain prophets and teachers: <u>Barnabas</u>, <u>Simeon</u> who was called <u>Niger</u>, <u>Lucius</u> of Cyrene, <u>Manaen</u> who had been brought up with Herod the tetrarch, and <u>Saul</u>.

## <u>Barnabas</u>

- 1. Encourager (Joseph)
- 2. Generous giver
- 3. Available
- 4. Good man
- 5. Full of the Holy Spirit
- 6. Full of faith
- Sought out others not engaged and drew them into serving the Lord together

<u>Simeon</u> who was called <u>Niger</u> (black)

Lucius of Cyrene

<u>Manaen</u> who had been <u>brought up</u> with <u>Herod</u> <u>the tetrarch</u>.

<u>Manaen</u> grew up in <u>Herod's</u> vile, polluted family. And yet the Lord <u>rescued</u> him and <u>saved</u> him and <u>called</u> him to the ministry.

**Saul:** Who became the Apostle Paul. Here **Saul** is mentioned **last** under the leadership of Barnabas. You never really know who is among us being pouring into! Paul wrote13 New Testament books!

Acts 13:2: As <u>they ministered to the Lord</u> and fasted, the Holy Spirit said, "Now separate to Me Barnabas and Saul for the work to which I have called them."

**NIV:** While <u>they were worshiping the Lord</u> and fasting

Acts 13:2: As they <u>ministered to the Lord</u> and <u>fasted</u>, <u>the Holy Spirit said</u> (spoke), "Now separate to Me Barnabas and Saul..."

How did Holy Spirit speak? In context it was probably through the <u>gift</u> of <u>prophecy</u>.

**Romans 12:6:** Having then **<u>gifts</u>** differing according to the **<u>grace</u>** that is given to us, **<u>let us use them</u>**: if **<u>prophecy</u>**, let us **<u>prophesy in proportion to our faith</u>**.

**1 Corinthians 14:1:** Pursue love, and <u>desire spiritual</u> gifts, but especially that you may prophesy.

**1 Corinthians 14:3:** But he who **prophesies** speaks **strengthening**, **encouragement** and **comfort**.

**Acts 13:2:** As they ministered to the Lord and fasted, the Holy Spirit said, "<u>Now</u> separate to Me Barnabas and Saul for the work to which I have called them."

**Acts 9:15-16:** He is a chosen vessel of Mine to bear My name before Gentiles, kings, and the children of Israel. For I will show him how many things he must <u>suffer</u> for My name's sake.

**Now** meant there was to be no delay! The **timing** of the Lord is always so important!

Antioch was a church **marked** by...

- 1. A Leader drew others into leadership
- 2. An abundance of leaders (diversity and unity)
- 3. Leaders who **first ministered to the Lord**
- 4. Fasting
- 5. Praying
- 6. Teaching the Word of God
- 7. Prophecy: the Holy Spirit was speaking
- 8. People called to the **work** of the Lord
- 9. Sensitivity to **timing**
- 10.Laying on of hands
- 11. Missionaries being sent out

**Acts 13:2:** As they <u>ministered to the Lord</u> and <u>fasted</u>, the <u>Holy Spirit said</u>, "Now separate to Me Barnabas and Saul for the <u>work</u> to which <u>I have called them</u>."

What is the **work** that God is **calling** me to do?

**Ephesians 2:8-10:** For by **grace** you have been **saved** through **faith**, and that **not of yourselves**; it is the **gift** of God, **not of works**, lest anyone should boast. For we are His **workmanship**, created in Christ Jesus **for good works**, which God prepared beforehand **that we should walk in them**.

What is the **work** that God is **<u>calling</u>** me to do?

**1Corinthians 15:58:** Therefore, my beloved brethren, be steadfast, immovable, <u>always abounding in the work of</u> <u>the Lord</u>, knowing that your <u>labor</u> is <u>not in vain</u> in the Lord.

Hebrews 6:10: For God is <u>not unjust</u> to forget your <u>work</u> and <u>labor</u> of love which you have shown toward His name, in that you have ministered to the saints, and <u>do</u> <u>minister</u>.
