The Rich Young Ruler Part 2 Luke 18:18-30

Luke 18:18: Now a certain <u>ruler</u> asked Him, saying, "<u>Good</u> Teacher, what shall I <u>do</u> to inherit <u>eternal life</u>?"

Luke 18:19: So Jesus said to him, "Why do you call Me **good**? **No one is good** but **One**, that is, **God**."

Luke 18:20: You know the commandments: "Do not commit adultery," "Do not murder," "Do not steal," "Do not bear false witness," "Honor your father and your mother."

Luke 18:21: And he said, "All these things I have kept from my youth."

- Riches
- Youth
- Power
- Religious

Luke 18:22: So when Jesus heard these things, He <u>said</u> to him, (Mark - <u>looking at him, He loved him</u>) "You still lack <u>one thing</u>. <u>Sell all that you have</u> and distribute to the <u>poor</u>, and you will have <u>treasure in heaven</u>; and <u>come</u>, <u>follow Me</u>."

Exodus 20:3: You shall have no other gods before Me.

Jesus put His **finger** on this **young**, **rich** man's **sin**!

- Idolatry!
- Living for **riches**!
- Living for **earthly treasure!**

His <u>sin</u> was that his <u>possessions</u> possessed him.

Sell all that you have and distribute to the **poor**, and you will have **treasure in heaven**; and **come**, **follow Me.**

Luke 18:23: <u>But</u> when he <u>heard</u> this, he <u>became</u> <u>very</u> <u>sorrowful</u>, (he <u>went away very sorrowful</u>) for he was <u>very</u> <u>rich</u>.

Luke 18:24: And when Jesus saw that he became <u>very</u> <u>sorrowful</u>, He said, "How <u>hard</u> it is for those who have <u>riches</u> to <u>enter</u> the <u>kingdom of God</u>!"

Luke 18:25: For it is easier for a <u>camel</u> to go through the <u>eye of a needle</u> than for a <u>rich man</u> to <u>enter</u> the <u>kingdom of God</u>.

1 Timothy 6:17-19: Command those who are <u>rich</u> in this <u>present age</u> not to be <u>haughty</u>, nor to <u>trust</u> in <u>uncertain</u> <u>riches but</u> in the <u>living God</u>, who <u>gives us richly all</u> <u>things to enjoy</u>. Let them <u>do good</u>, that they be <u>rich in</u> <u>good works</u>, <u>ready to give</u>, <u>willing to share</u>, <u>storing up</u> <u>for themselves a good foundation for the time to</u> <u>come</u>, that they may <u>lay hold on eternal life</u>.

Luke 18:26: And those who heard it said, "Who then can be saved?"

Luke 18:27: But He said, "The things which are **impossible with men** are **possible with God**."

Gethsemane

Luke 18:28: Then Peter said, "See, we have left all and followed You.

Luke 9:23-24: If <u>anyone</u> desires to <u>come</u> after <u>Me</u>, let him <u>deny himself</u>, and <u>take up his cross daily</u>, and <u>follow Me</u>. For whoever desires to <u>save</u> (find) his life will <u>lose</u> it, but whoever <u>loses</u> his life for My sake will <u>save</u> (find) it.

Luke 14:25-33: Now great multitudes went with Him. And He turned and said to them, "If anyone comes to Me and does not hate his father and mother, wife and children, brothers and sisters, yes, and his own life also, he *cannot be My disciple.* And whoever does not bear his **cross** and **come** after **Me** ***cannot be My disciple**.* For which of you, intending to build a tower, does not sit down first and count the cost, whether he has enough to finish it - lest, after he has laid the foundation, and is not able to finish, all who see it begin to mock him, saying, 'This man began to build and was not able to finish'? Or what king, going to make war against another king, does not sit down first and consider whether he is able with ten thousand to meet him who comes against him with twenty thousand? Or else, while the other is still a great way off, he sends a delegation and asks conditions of peace. So likewise, whoever of you does not forsake all that he has *cannot be My disciple.*

Luke 18:28: Then Peter said, "See, we have left all and followed You.

Luke 18:29-30: So He said to them, "Assuredly, I say to you, there is no one who has left house or parents or brothers or wife or children, for the sake of the kingdom of God, who shall not receive many times more in this present time, and in the age to come eternal life."

You **can't** out-give God!

Luke 6:38: <u>Give</u>, and it will be <u>given to you</u>: good measure, pressed down, shaken together, and running over will be put into your bosom. For with the <u>same</u> <u>measure that you use</u>, it will be <u>measured back to you</u>.

1 Corinthians 2:9: Eye has not seen, nor ear heard, nor have entered into the heart of man the things which God has prepared for those who **love Him**.
