## John's Baptism

Luke 3:1-20

Luke 3:1-2: Now in the <u>fifteenth year</u> of the reign of <u>Tiberius Caesar</u>, <u>Pontius Pilate</u> being governor of Judea, <u>Herod</u> (Antipas) being <u>tetrarch</u> of Galilee, his brother <u>Philip</u> tetrarch of Iturea and the region of Trachonitis, and <u>Lysanias</u> tetrarch of Abilene, while <u>Annas</u> and <u>Caiaphas</u> were high priests, the <u>word of God</u> came to <u>John</u> the <u>son of Zacharias</u> in the <u>wilderness</u>.

John 5:35: He was the **burning** and **shining** lamp...

## word of God

**Matthew 3:2:** Repent for the kingdom of heaven is at hand!

**Luke 3:3:** And he went into all the region around the Jordan, preaching <u>a baptism of repentance</u> for the remission of sins.

Luke 3:4: As it is written in the book of the words of <a href="Isaiah">Isaiah</a> (40:3-5) the prophet, saying: "The voice of one crying in the wilderness: 'Prepare the way of the Lord; make His paths straight.' "

**Luke 3:5-6:** "Every <u>valley</u> shall be filled and every mountain and <u>hill</u> brought <u>low</u>; the <u>crooked</u> places shall be made straight and the <u>rough</u> ways smooth; and <u>all</u> <u>flesh</u> shall see <u>the salvation of God</u>."

**Luke 3:7:** Then he said to the <u>multitudes</u> that came out to be baptized by him, "<u>Brood of vipers</u>! Who <u>warned</u> you to <u>flee</u> from the <u>wrath</u> <u>to come</u>?"

Luke 3:8: "Therefore <u>bear fruits worthy of repentance</u>, and do not begin to say to yourselves, 'We have <u>Abraham as our father</u>.' For I say to you that God is able to raise up children to Abraham from these <u>stones</u>."

**Ezekiel 36:26:** And I will give you a new heart, and I will put a new spirit in you. I will take out your **stony**, stubborn heart and give you a tender, responsive heart.

**Luke 3:9:** "And even now the <u>ax</u> is <u>laid to the root of</u> <u>the trees</u>. Therefore every <u>tree</u> which does not <u>bear</u> <u>good fruit</u> is cut down and thrown into the <u>fire</u>."

**Luke 3:10:** So the people asked him, saying, "What shall we do then?"

**Luke 3:11:** He answered and said to them, "He who has **two tunics**, let him give to him who has **none**; and he who has **food**, let him do **likewise**."

1 John 3:18: My little children, let us <u>not love</u> in <u>word</u> or in <u>tongue</u>, but in <u>deed</u> and in <u>truth</u>.

**Luke 3:12-13:** Then <u>tax collectors</u> also came to be baptized, and said to him, "Teacher, what shall we do?" and he said to them, "<u>Collect no more than what is appointed for you</u>."

**Luke 3:14:** Likewise the <u>soldiers</u> asked him, saying, "And what shall we do?" So he said to them, "Do not <u>intimidate</u> anyone or <u>accuse</u> falsely, and be <u>content</u> with your <u>wages</u>."

Luke 3:15-17: Now as the people were in <u>expectation</u>, and all reasoned in their hearts about <u>John</u>, whether he was the <u>Christ</u> or not, John answered, saying to all, "I indeed baptize you with water; but One mightier than I is coming, whose sandal strap I am not worthy to loose. <u>He</u> will <u>baptize</u> you with the <u>Holy Spirit</u> and <u>fire</u>. His winnowing fan is in His hand, and He will thoroughly clean out His threshing floor, and gather the <u>wheat</u> into His barn; but the <u>chaff</u> He will burn with unquenchable fire."

Luke 3:18-20: And with many other <u>exhortations</u> he <u>preached</u> to the people. But <u>Herod</u> ( <u>Antipas</u>) the tetrarch, being <u>rebuked by him</u> concerning <u>Herodias</u>, his brother <u>Philip's wife</u>, and for all the <u>evils</u> which Herod had done, also added this, above all, that he <u>shut John</u> <u>up in prison</u>.

Mark 6:18: It is not <u>lawful</u> for <u>you</u> to have your <u>brother's wife</u>.

**Ezekiel 36:26:** And I will give you a **new heart**, and I will put a **new spirit** in you. I will take out your **stony**, **stubborn** heart and give you a **tender**, **responsive** heart.
