
Zacchaeus - A Notorious Sinner Saved! Luke 19:1-10

Luke 19:1: Then Jesus entered and passed through <u>Jericho</u>.

Luke 19:2: Now behold, there was a man named <u>Zacchaeus</u> who was a <u>chief</u> <u>tax collector</u>, and he was <u>rich</u>.

Luke 19:3-4: And <u>he sought to see</u> who Jesus was, but could not because of the crowd, for he was of <u>short</u> <u>stature</u>. So he <u>ran</u> ahead and <u>climbed</u> <u>up into a sycamore tree</u> to <u>see Him</u>, for He was going to pass that way.

Luke 19:5: And when Jesus came to the place, He looked up and saw him, and said to him, "<u>Zacchaeus</u>, make <u>haste</u> and come down, for <u>today</u> I <u>must</u> stay at your house."

Jesus called **Zacchaeus** by his **name**!

There was an **<u>urgency</u>** in Jesus!

This was Zacchaeus' **<u>day</u>**!

Is it possible that this is **your** day?

Now is the **day** of **salvation**!

Hebrews 4:7: <u>Today</u>, if you hear <u>His voice</u>, don't <u>harden</u> your <u>heart</u>.

Luke 19:6: So he made haste and came down, and <u>received Him joyfully</u>.

In verse 5, we see God **sovereignly seeking** Zacchaeus!

In verse 6, we see man's **<u>responsibility</u>** to <u>**receive**</u> Jesus!

Luke 19:7: But when <u>they</u> saw it, <u>they</u> all <u>complained</u>, saying, He has gone to be a guest with a man who is a <u>sinner</u>.

Mark 2:15-17: Now it happened, as <u>He</u> was dining in Levi's house, that many tax collectors and sinners also sat together with Jesus and His disciples; <u>for there were</u> <u>many</u>, and <u>they followed Him</u>. And when the scribes and Pharisees saw Him eating with the tax collectors and sinners, they said to His disciples, "How is it that He <u>eats</u> and <u>drinks</u> with <u>tax collectors</u> and <u>sinners</u>?" When Jesus heard it, He said to them, "Those who are <u>well</u> have no need of a <u>physician</u>, but those who are <u>sick</u>. I did not come to call the <u>righteous</u>, but <u>sinners</u>, to <u>repentance</u>."

Luke 7:33-35: For John the Baptist came neither eating bread nor drinking wine, and you say, "He has a demon." The <u>Son of Man</u> has come <u>eating</u> and <u>drinking</u>, and you say, "Look, a glutton and a winebibber, <u>a friend of tax</u> <u>collectors and sinners</u>!" But wisdom is justified by all her children.

Luke 19:8: Then Zacchaeus stood and said to the Lord, "Look, Lord, I give half of my goods to the poor; and if I have taken anything from anyone by false accusation, I restore fourfold."

Faith and Works

Zacchaeus' **faith saved** him!

Zacchaeus had <u>true</u> saving <u>faith</u> that produced <u>works</u>!

<u>**True</u>** saving faith produces the <u>**fruit**</u> of <u>**repentance!**</u></u>

Luke 19:9: Jesus said to him, "Today <u>salvation</u> has come to this house, because he also is a <u>son</u> of <u>Abraham</u>."

Are you **<u>saved</u>**?

Romans 10:9-10: If you <u>confess</u> with <u>your mouth</u> the <u>Lord Jesus</u> and <u>believe</u> in your <u>heart</u> that <u>God has raised</u> <u>Him from the dead</u>, you will be <u>saved</u>. For with the <u>heart</u> one <u>believes</u> unto <u>righteousness</u>, and with the <u>mouth confession</u> is made unto <u>salvation</u>.

<u>Abraham's</u> life was marked by <u>Faith</u> and <u>Works</u>.

Luke 19:10: For the <u>Son of Man</u> has come to <u>seek</u> and to <u>save</u> that which was <u>lost</u>.
