## Christmas In July

Luke 2:1-14

Luke 2:1: And it came to pass in those <u>days</u> that <u>a decree</u> went out from <u>Caesar</u> Augustus that all the world should be registered. (KJV: "taxed")

Gaius Julius Caesar Octavianus - grand nephew

**Scripture** gives us a unique **vantage point**. (Jeremiah 1:12)

Micah 5:2: But you, <u>Bethlehem</u>...though you are <u>little</u> among the thousands of Judah, yet out of you shall come forth to Me the <u>One</u> to be <u>Ruler in Israel</u>, whose goings forth are from of old, <u>from everlasting</u>.

Galatians 4:4

Luke 2:2-3: This census first took place while Quirinius was governing Syria. So all went to be <u>registered</u>, everyone to his <u>own city</u>.

Luke 2:4-5: Joseph also went up from Galilee, out of the city of <u>Nazareth</u>, into Judea, to the city of David, which is called <u>Bethlehem</u>, because he was of the house and lineage of David, to be registered with Mary, his betrothed wife, who was <u>with child</u>. (KJV: "great with child")

Luke 2:6: So it was, that while they were there, the days were completed for her to be delivered.

Luke 2:7: And <u>she</u> brought forth her firstborn Son, and wrapped Him in <u>swaddling cloths</u>, and laid Him in a <u>manger</u>, because there was <u>no room for</u> them in the inn.

## PROPHETIC

Swaddling cloths: Jesus' death and burial

Manger: • bread of life • house of bread • feeding trough

Stable (cave): Lamb of God

No room for them in the inn: Joy to the World

Luke 2:8: Now there were in the same country <u>shepherds</u> living out in the <u>fields</u>, keeping watch over their flock by night.

Why is the setting the <u>fields</u> of Bethlehem? This is where the Passover lambs were raised.

Luke 2:9: And behold, <u>an angel</u> of the Lord stood before them, and the <u>glory of the Lord</u> shone around them, and they were <u>greatly afraid</u>.

How powerful are the angels? In the Old Testament one angel killed 186,000 soldiers.

Luke 2:10: Then the angel said to them, "<u>Do not be afraid</u>, for behold, I bring you good tidings of great joy which will be to <u>all people</u>."

Luke 2:11: "For there is born to you this day in the city of David a <u>Savior</u>, who is Christ the Lord."

The Good News is **not** that He is <u>King of Kings</u> or <u>Judge</u> but that He is Savior!

Luke 2:12: "And this will be the <u>sign</u> to you: You will find a <u>Babe wrapped in swaddling cloths</u>, lying in a <u>manger</u>."

Luke 2:13: And suddenly there was <u>with the angel</u> a <u>multitude</u> of the <u>heavenly</u> <u>host</u> [armies] <u>praising God</u> and saying:

Luke 2:14: "Glory to God in the highest, and on earth peace, goodwill toward men!"

The angels **provoke** the church to worship. We have a **greater reason** to praise and glorify God than the angels!
