Good Friday

Thursday Night:

John 13:13-17: You call Me Teacher and Lord, and you say well, for so <u>I am</u>. If I then, your Lord and Teacher, have <u>washed your feet</u>, you also ought to wash one another's feet. For I have given you an <u>example</u>, that you should do as I have done to you. Most assuredly, I say to you, a servant is not greater than his master; nor is he who is sent greater than he who sent him. If you know these things, <u>blessed</u> are you if you <u>do</u> them.

Matthew 26:26-29: And as they were eating, Jesus took bread, blessed and broke it, and gave it to the disciples and said, "Take, eat; this is My body." Then He took the cup, and gave thanks, and gave it to them, saying, "Drink from it, all of you. For this is My blood of the new covenant, which is shed for many for the remission of sins. But I say to you, I will not drink of this fruit of the vine from now on until that day when I drink it new with you in My Father's kingdom."

Matthew 26:30: And when they had <u>sung</u> a <u>hymn</u>, they went out to the <u>Mount of Olives</u>.

Matthew 26:39: He went a little farther and fell on His **face**, and prayed, saying, "Oh My Father, **if it is possible**, let this **cup** pass from Me; nevertheless, not as I will, but as You will."

Matthew 26:46: <u>Rise</u>, let us be going. See, My betrayer is at hand.

Matthew 26:50: But Jesus said to him, "<u>Friend</u>, why have you come?" Then they came and laid hands on Jesus and took Him.

Matthew 26:51: And suddenly, <u>one</u> of those who were with Jesus stretched out his hand and drew his sword, struck the <u>servant</u> of the high priest, and <u>cut off his ear</u>.

Luke 22:61-62: And the Lord turned and looked at Peter. Then Peter remembered the word of the Lord, how He had said to him, "Before the rooster crows, you will deny Me three times." So Peter went out and wept bitterly.

Luke 22:63-65: Now the men who held Jesus <u>mocked</u>
Him and <u>beat</u> Him. And having <u>blindfolded</u> Him, they

<u>struck</u> Him on the <u>face</u> and asked Him, saying,

"Prophesy! Who is the one who struck You?" And many
other things they <u>blasphemously</u> spoke against Him.

Early Friday Morning:

Matthew 27:3-5: Then <u>Judas</u>, His betrayer, seeing that He had been condemned, was <u>remorseful</u> and brought back the <u>thirty pieces of silver</u> to the chief priests and elders, saying, "I have sinned by betraying <u>innocent</u> <u>blood</u>." Then he threw down the pieces of silver in the temple and departed, and went and <u>hanged</u> himself.

Matthew 27:24: When Pilate saw that he could not prevail at all, but rather that a tumult was rising, he took water and washed his hands before the multitude, saying, "I am innocent of the blood of this just Person. You see to it."

Matthew 27:25: And all the people answered and said, "His blood be on us and on our children."

Matthew 27:26: Then he released <u>Barabbas</u> to them; and when he had <u>scourged</u> Jesus, he delivered Him to be <u>crucified</u>.

Matthew 27:27-31: Then the soldiers of the governor took Jesus into the <u>Praetorium</u> and gathered the whole garrison around Him. And they stripped Him and put a <u>scarlet</u> robe on Him. When they had twisted a <u>crown</u> of thorns, they put it on His head, and a <u>reed</u> in His right hand. And they <u>bowed the knee</u> before Him and mocked Him, saying, "<u>Hail</u>, King of the Jews!" Then they <u>spat</u> on Him, and took the reed and struck Him on the head. When they mocked Him, they took the robe off Him, put His own clothes on Him, and led Him away to be <u>crucified</u>.

Friday at 9 am:

Luke 23:34: Then Jesus said, "Father, <u>forgive</u> them, for they do not know what they do."

Luke 23:43: And Jesus said to him, "<u>Assuredly</u>, I say to you, today you will be with Me in <u>Paradise</u>."

Matthew 27:45-46: Now from the <u>sixth</u> hour until the <u>ninth</u> hour there was <u>darkness</u> over all the land. And about the <u>ninth</u> hour Jesus cried out with a loud voice, saying, "Eli, Eli, lama sabachthani?" that is, "<u>My God, My God, why have You forsaken Me</u>?"

John 19:26-27: When Jesus therefore saw His mother, and <u>the disciple whom He loved</u> standing by, He said to His mother, "<u>Woman, behold your son</u>!" Then He said to the disciple, "<u>Behold your mother</u>!"

John 19:28: I thirst!

John 19:30: It is finished!



Luke 23:46: He said, "Father, into Your hands <u>I commit</u> My spirit." Having said this, He breathed His last.

Galatians 2:20: I have been crucified with Christ; it is no longer I who live, but Christ lives in me; and the life which I now live in the flesh I live by faith in the Son of God, who loved me and gave Himself for me.
