The Rich Young Ruler Mark 10:17-27

Romans 13:11: And do this, <u>knowing the time</u>, that now it is high time to awake out of sleep; for now, our salvation is nearer than when we first believed.

Mark 10:17-27: Now as He was going out on the road, one came running, knelt before Him, and asked Him, "Good Teacher, what shall I do that I may inherit eternal life?" So, Jesus said to him, "Why do you call Me good? No one is good but One, that is, God. You know the commandments: 'Do not commit adultery,' 'Do not murder,' 'Do not steal,' 'Do not bear false witness,' 'Do not defraud,' 'Honor your father and your mother." And he answered and said to Him, "Teacher, all these things I have kept from my youth." Then Jesus, looking at him, loved him, and said to him, "One thing you lack: Go your way, sell whatever you have and give to the poor, and you will have treasure in heaven; and come, take up the cross, and follow Me." But he was sad at this word, and went away sorrowful, for he had great possessions. Then Jesus looked around and said to His disciples, "How hard it is for those who have riches to enter the kingdom of God!" And the disciples were astonished at His words. But Jesus answered again and said to them, "Children, how hard it is for those who trust in riches to enter the kingdom of God! It is easier for a camel to go through the eye of a needle than for a rich man to enter the kingdom of God." And they were greatly astonished, saying among themselves, "Who then can be saved?" But Jesus looked at them and said, "With men it is impossible, but not with God; for with God all things are possible."

Mark 10:18: So, Jesus said to him, "Why do you call Me good? No one is good but One, that is, God.

Mark 10:19: You know the commandments: "Do not commit adultery," "Do not murder," "Do not steal," "Do not bear false witness," "Do not defraud," "Honor your father and your mother".

Mark 10:20: And he answered and said to Him, "Teacher, all these things I have kept from my youth."

Mark 10:21: Then Jesus, looking at him, <u>loved him</u>, and said to him, "One thing you lack: Go your way, sell whatever you have and give to the poor, and you will have treasure in heaven; <u>and come, take up the cross, and</u> follow Me."

Mark 10:22: But he was sad at this word, and <u>went away sorrowful</u>, for he had great possessions.

Mark 10:23-24: Then Jesus looked around and said to His disciples, "How hard it is for those who have riches to enter the kingdom of God!" And the disciples were astonished at His words. But Jesus answered again and said to them, "Children, how hard it is for those who trust in riches to enter the kingdom of God!

Mark 10:25-26: It is easier for a camel to go through the eye of a needle than for a rich man to enter the kingdom of God. And they were greatly astonished, saying among themselves, "Who then can be saved?"

Mark 10:27: But Jesus looked at them and said, "With men it is impossible, but not with God; for with God all things are possible."



Mark 10:17-27

Matthew 19:16-26

Galatians 2:16-21: Knowing that a man is not justified by the works of the law but by faith in Jesus Christ, even we have believed in Christ Jesus, that we might be justified by faith in Christ and not by the works of the law; for by the works of the law no flesh shall be justified. I have been crucified with Christ; it is no longer I who live, but Christ lives in me; and the life which I now live in the flesh I live by faith in the Son of God, who loved me and gave Himself for me. I do not set aside the grace of God; for if righteousness comes through the law, then Christ died in vain.

Galatians 3:24: Therefore, the law was our tutor to bring us to Christ, that we might be justified by faith.

Psalm 103:1: Bless the Lord, oh my soul; and <u>all that is within me</u>, bless His holy name!

Hebrews 12:1-2: Therefore we also, since we are surrounded by so great a cloud of witnesses, <u>let us lay aside every weight</u>, and <u>the sin which so easily ensnares us</u>, and let us run with endurance the race that is set before us, <u>looking unto Jesus</u>, the author and finisher of our faith, who for the joy that was set before Him endured the cross, despising the shame, and has sat down at the right hand of the throne of God.

John 15:1-4: I am the true vine, and My Father is the vinedresser. Every branch in Me that does not bear fruit He takes away; and every branch that bears fruit He prunes, that it may bear more fruit. You are already clean because of the word which I have spoken to you. Abide in Me, and I

in you. As the branch cannot bear fruit of itself, unless it abides in the vine, neither can you, unless you abide in Me.

Philippians 3:13-14: (NLT) No, dear brothers and sisters, I have not achieved it, but I focus on this **one thing**: forgetting the past and looking forward to what lies ahead, I press on to reach the end of the race and receive the heavenly prize for which God, through Christ Jesus, is calling us.

Who then can be saved?

Mark 10:27: But Jesus looked at them and said, "With men it is impossible, but not with God; for with God all things are possible.

Romans 10:9: If you <u>confess with your mouth that Jesus is Lord</u> and <u>believe in your heart</u> that God raised him from the dead, <u>you will be saved</u>.
