## Let The Little Children Come To Me! Luke 18:15-17

**Luke 18:15:** Then <u>they</u> also brought <u>infants</u> to Him that He might <u>touch</u> them; but when the disciples saw it, they rebuked them.

Matthew 19:13-15: Then <u>little children</u> were brought to Him that He might <u>put His hands on them</u> and <u>pray</u>, but the disciples rebuked them. But Jesus said, "Let the little children come to Me, and do not forbid them; for of such is the kingdom of heaven." And He <u>laid His hands on them</u> and departed from there.

Mark 10:16: And <u>He took them up in His arms</u>, <u>laid His</u> <u>hands on them</u>, and <u>blessed</u> (fervently) them.

It's **biblical** to **offer**, **dedicate**, **pray**, **bless**, and **give** our children to the Lord.

Hannah <u>dedicated</u> (gave) Samuel to the Lord, <u>all the</u> <u>days of his life</u>. (1 Samuel 1:28)

It is **not biblical** to **baptize** infants!

**Mark 16:15-16:** Go into all the world and preach the gospel to every creature. He who **believes** and is **baptized** will be **saved**; but he who does **not believe** will be **condemned**.

Acts 2:38: <u>Repent</u>, and let every one of you <u>be baptized</u> in the name of Jesus Christ for the forgiveness of sins.

## Acts 8:37: If you believe with all your heart.

If you were **<u>baptized</u>** as an <u>infant?</u>

What about baptizing **small children**?

**Luke 18:15:** Then **they** also **brought infants** to Him that He might **touch** them.

Matthew 19:13, 15: Then little children were brought to Him that He might <u>put His hands on them</u> and <u>pray.</u> And He <u>laid His hands on them</u> and departed from there.

Mark 10:16: And <u>He took them up in His arms</u>, <u>laid His</u> <u>hands on them</u>, and blessed them.

**Luke 4:40:** When the sun was setting, all those who had any that were sick with various diseases brought them to Him; and He **laid His hands on every one of them** and healed them.

Mark 8:22-25: Then He came to Bethsaida; and <u>they</u> brought a <u>blind man</u> to Him, and begged Him to <u>touch</u> him. So He took the blind man by the hand and led him out of the town. And when He had <u>spit</u> on his eyes (John 9) and <u>put</u> <u>His hands on him</u>, He asked him if he saw anything. And he looked up and said, "I see men like trees, walking." Then He put <u>His hands on his eyes again</u> and made him look up. And he was restored and saw everyone clearly. Mark 16:18: They will <u>lay hands</u> on the <u>sick</u>, and they will <u>recover</u>.

**Luke 13:13:** He <u>laid His hands on her</u>, and immediately she was made <u>straight</u>, and <u>glorified</u> God.

Acts 8:14-17: Now when the apostles who were at Jerusalem heard that Samaria had received the word of God, they sent Peter and John to them, who, when they had come down, **prayed** for them that they might **receive the Holy Spirit**. For as yet He had **fallen upon** none of them. They had only been baptized in the name of the Lord Jesus. Then they **laid hands on them**, and they **received the Holy Spirit**.

Acts 9:17: Ananias laid hands on Saul (Paul)

Acts 19:6: And when Paul had <u>laid hands on them</u>, the <u>Holy Spirit came upon them</u>, and they spoke with <u>tongues</u> and <u>prophesied</u>.

Acts 6:6: The Apostles laid hands on deacons...

Acts 13:3: ...they laid hands on Saul and Barnabas...

**1 Timothy 4:14:** Do not **<u>neglect</u>** the **<u>gift</u>** that is in you, which was given to you by **<u>prophecy</u>** with the **<u>laying on of the</u>** <u>**hands**</u> of the <u>**eldership**</u>.

**2 Timothy 1:6:** Therefore I remind you to <u>stir up</u> the <u>gift of</u> <u>God</u> which is in you through the <u>laying on of my hands</u>.

Luke 18:15: Then <u>they</u> also brought <u>infants</u> to Him that He might <u>touch</u> them; <u>but</u> when the disciples saw it, they <u>rebuked them</u>. (strong disapproval)

**Luke 18:16:** But Jesus called them to Him and said, "<u>Let the</u> <u>little children come to Me</u>, and <u>do not forbid them</u> (speak seriously); for <u>of such</u> is the <u>kingdom of God</u>."

- Totally **dependent**
- Unable to provide for themselves.
- No achievements
- No accomplishments
- Willing and happy to receive help and gifts
- Eager, expectant, hopeful, drawn to relationship
- Tender, teachable and lead-able

Luke 18:17: <u>Assuredly</u>, I say to you, <u>whoever</u> does not <u>receive</u> the <u>kingdom of God</u> <u>as a little child</u> will by no means <u>enter</u> it.
