## **Blind Bartimaeus**

Luke 18:35-43



Luke 18:31-33: Then He took the twelve aside and said to them, "Behold, we are going up to Jerusalem, and all things that are written by the prophets concerning the Son of Man will be accomplished. For He will be delivered to the Gentiles and will be mocked and insulted and spit upon. They will scourge Him and kill Him. And the third day He will rise again." But they understood none of these things; this saying was hidden from them, and they did not know the things which were spoken.

**Luke 18:35:** Then it happened, as **He** was coming **near Jericho**, that a **certain blind** man sat by the road **begging**.

**Matthew 20:29-30:** Now as they <u>went out of Jericho</u>, a great multitude followed Him. And behold, <u>two blind</u> men...

**Mark 10:46:** Now they came to Jericho. As He went out of Jericho with His disciples and a great multitude, blind **Bartimaeus**, the son of **Timaeus**, sat by the road begging.

**Luke 18:36:** And **hearing** a **multitude passing by**, he asked what it meant.

His life was <u>miserable</u>, <u>hopeless</u>, and <u>stuck</u>; he was <u>missing out</u>.

**Luke 18:37:** So **they** told him that **Jesus of Nazareth** was passing by.

Luke 18:38: And <u>he</u> cried out, saying, "<u>Jesus, Son of David</u>, have <u>mercy</u> on me!"

Bartimaeus was blind but he could see that Jesus was the promised Son of David (The Messiah).

Luke 18:38: And <u>he</u> cried out, saying, "<u>Jesus, Son of</u> <u>David</u>, have <u>mercy</u> on me!"

**Luke 18:39:** Then those who went before warned him that he should **be quiet**; but he **cried out all the more**, "**Son of David**, have **mercy** on **me**!"

He kept crying out until Jesus had **mercy** on him... until **Jesus** changed his life!

**Luke 18:40:** So Jesus <u>stood still</u> and commanded him to be brought to Him. And when he had come near, He asked him...

- Joshua (Hebrew); Jesus (Greek)
- Joshua & Moses; Jesus & the law of Moses
- Joshua & Jordan crossing; Jesus & Jordan baptism
- Joshua <u>cried</u> out & walls <u>fell</u>; Jesus <u>cried</u> <u>out</u>;
   <u>stood up</u>
- Joshua: Jericho story of <u>destruction</u>; Jesus: story of <u>salvation</u>
- Joshua: <u>sun stood still</u>; One Greater <u>sun stood</u>
   <u>still</u>

Mark 10:50: And <u>throwing aside</u> his <u>garment</u>, he rose and came to Jesus.

**2 Corinthians 5:17:** Therefore, if **anyone** is **in Christ**, he is a **new creation**; **old things** have **passed away**; behold, **all things** have become **new**.

Luke 18:41: saying, "What do you want Me to do for you?" He said, "Lord, that I may receive my sight."

Jesus was drawing this **faith** out of Bartimaeus!

Romans 10:8-9: The word is <u>near</u> you, in your <u>mouth</u> and in your heart (that is, the word of faith which we preach): that if you <u>confess</u> with your <u>mouth</u> the <u>Lord</u> <u>Jesus</u> and <u>believe</u> in your <u>heart</u> that God has <u>raised Him</u> <u>from the dead</u>, you will be <u>saved</u>.

**Luke 18:42:** Then Jesus said to him, "Receive your sight; your <u>faith</u> has made you <u>well</u> (saved)."

Bartimaeus' **physical healing** was also a picture of the inner **salvation** that was taking place!

Matthew 20:34: So Jesus had <u>compassion</u> and <u>touched</u> their eyes.

**Luke 18:43:** And immediately he received his sight, and **followed Him**, **glorifying God**. And all the people, when they saw it, **gave praise to God**.

## Bartimaeus' faith

- He BELIEVED Jesus was the son of David (Messiah)
- He **HUMBLED** himself and kept asking for **mercy**
- He THREW ASIDE garment (old) believing for a new life
- He CALLED Jesus Lord
- His **FAITH** in Jesus **healed** him & **saved** him
- He **FOLLOWED Jesus**
- He GLORIFIED God
- Others PRAISED God for his changed life

**Luke 18:43:** And immediately he received his sight, and **followed Him**, **glorifying God**. And all the people, when they saw it, **gave praise to God**.

**Luke 2:20:** Then **the shepherds** returned, **glorifying** and **praising God** for all the things that they had heard and seen, as it was told them.

**Luke 5:25-26:** Immediately he rose up before them, took up what he had been lying on, and departed to his own house, **glorifying God**. They were all amazed and began **glorifying God**.

Luke 17:15-17: And one of them, when he saw that he was healed, returned, and with a <u>loud voice glorified</u>

<u>God</u>, and fell down on his face at His feet, giving Him thanks. And he was a Samaritan. So Jesus answered and said, "Were there not ten cleansed? But <u>where are the nine</u>?"

Acts 2:46-47: So continuing daily with one accord in the temple, and breaking bread from house to house, they ate their food with gladness and simplicity of heart, **praising God** and having favor with all the people. And the Lord added to the church daily those who were being saved.

Acts 3:8-9: So he, leaping up, stood and walked and entered the temple with them - walking, leaping, and praising God. And all the people saw him walking and praising God.
