God Will Provide Himself The Lamb Genesis 22:1-14

Genesis 22:1: Now it came to pass after these things that **God tested Abraham** and said to him, "Abraham!" and he said, "Here I am."

God often **tests** us to reveal what's truly in our **hearts**.

Proverbs 17:3: The <u>refining pot</u> is for <u>silver</u> and the <u>furnace</u> for <u>gold</u>, but the <u>Lord tests the hearts.</u>

<u>Isaac</u> was God's <u>gift</u> to Abraham, but if the <u>gift</u> becomes more important than the <u>giver</u>, it becomes an **idol**.

Genesis 22:2: Then He said, "Take now your son, <u>your</u> <u>only son Isaac</u>, <u>whom you love</u>, and go to the <u>land of</u> <u>Moriah</u>, and <u>offer him</u> there as a <u>burnt offering</u> on one of the mountains of which I shall tell you."

This is the **first** time "love" is mentioned in the **Bible**.

John 3:16: For God so loved the world that He gave His only begotten Son, that whoever believes in Him should not perish but have everlasting life.

Mt. Moriah is a mountain ridge that runs from north to south through the city of <u>Jerusalem</u>.

Moriah literally means "Foreseen of Jehovah"

Isaiah 46:9-10: For I am God, and there is <u>no other</u>; I am God, and there is <u>none like Me</u>, <u>declaring the end from the beginning</u>, and from ancient times things that are not yet done.

Genesis 22:2: "Take now your son, your only son Isaac, whom you love, and go to the land of Moriah, and <u>offer</u>
<u>him</u> there as a <u>burnt offering</u> on one of the mountains of which I shall tell you."

Jesus was to be lifted up on the cross.

Jesus gave Himself completely for us, a sweet smelling aroma to God!

Genesis 22:3: So <u>Abraham</u> rose early in the morning and saddled his donkey, and took <u>two of his young men with him</u>, and <u>Isaac his son</u>; and he split the wood for the burnt offering, and arose and went to the place of which God had told him.

Matthew 27:38: Then <u>two thieves</u> were <u>crucified with</u> <u>Him</u>, one on the right and another on the left.

Genesis 22:4: Then <u>on the third day</u> Abraham lifted his eyes and saw the place afar off.

1 Corinthians 15:3-4: Christ <u>died for our sins</u> was <u>buried</u>, and He <u>rose again</u> the <u>third day</u> according to the <u>scriptures</u>.

Genesis 22:5: And Abraham said to his young men, "Stay here with the donkey; **the lad** and I will go yonder and **worship**, and **we will come back to you**."

Philippians 2:10: At the name of Jesus, every knee is going to bow and every tongue is going to confess that Jesus Christ is Lord to the glory of God the Father.

Hebrews 11:17–19: By faith Abraham, when he was tested, offered up Isaac concluding that God was able to raise him up, even from the dead, from which he also received him in a <u>figurative sense</u>.

Genesis 22:6: So Abraham took <u>the wood</u> of the burnt offering and <u>laid it on Isaac his son</u>; and <u>he took the fire</u> in his hand, and <u>a knife</u>, and the two of them went together.

<u>Isaac</u> carried the <u>wood</u> for his own death even as <u>Jesus</u> carried the <u>cross</u> to His crucifixion.

Abraham carried **the fire** which speaks of the Father's **fiery wrath** that was vented on His son Jesus in our place.

The **knife** speaks of how **Isaac** would have been **pierced**!

Genesis 22:7: But Isaac spoke to Abraham his father and said, "My father!" And he said, "Here I am, my son." Then he said, "Look, the <u>fire</u> and the <u>wood</u>, but <u>where is</u> <u>the lamb</u> for a burnt offering?"

Genesis 22:8: And Abraham said, "My son, <u>God will</u> <u>provide Himself the lamb for a burnt offering</u>." So the two of them went together.

God will provide Himself the Lamb for a burnt offering.

Genesis 22:9: Then they came to the place of which God had told him. And Abraham built an altar there and placed the wood in order; and **he bound Isaac** his son and laid him on the altar, upon the wood.

Isaac <u>submitted</u> to his father even as Jesus **submitted** to His Father. Matthew 26:39: "Oh My Father, <u>if it is possible</u>, let this <u>cup</u> pass from Me; nevertheless, <u>not as I will, but as You</u> will."

Genesis 22:10-12: And Abraham stretched out his hand and took the knife to slay his son. But the Angel of the Lord called to him from heaven and said, "Abraham, Abraham!" So he said, "Here I am." And He said, "Do not lay your hand on the lad, or do anything to him; for now I know that you fear God, since you have not withheld your son, your only son, from Me."

Abraham passed the **test.** He did love <u>God</u> the <u>giver</u> more then he loved <u>Isaac</u> the <u>gift</u>.

On the third day, Isaac lived!

Genesis 22:13: Then Abraham lifted his eyes and looked, and there behind him was a <u>ram</u> caught in a thicket by its horns. So Abraham went and took the ram, and offered it up <u>for a burnt offering instead of his son</u>.

The <u>ram</u> was God's provision for <u>Isaac</u>.

The <u>Lamb</u> that Abraham prophesied about was fulfilled in <u>Jesus</u>. God's provision for the <u>World</u>!

John 1:29: <u>Behold</u>! The <u>Lamb of God</u> who <u>takes away</u> the <u>sin of the world!</u>

Genesis 22:14: And Abraham called the name of the place, <u>The-Lord-Will-Provide</u>; as it is said to this day, "<u>In</u> <u>the Mount of the Lord it shall be provided</u>."

There on **Mt. Moriah**, 2000 years later, **God** provided Himself the Lamb!

Romans 4:25: He was delivered over to <u>death</u> for <u>our</u> <u>sins</u> and was <u>raised</u> to life for our <u>justification</u>.

Romans 10:9: If you confess with your mouth the Lord Jesus and believe in your heart that God has raised Him from the dead, you will be saved.

Romans 10:10: For with the <u>heart</u> one <u>believes</u> unto <u>righteousness</u>, and with the mouth <u>confession</u> is made unto <u>salvation</u>.

Romans 10:13: For whoever calls on the <u>name of the</u>
Lord shall be saved.

Matthew 12:31: "Therefore I say to you, <u>every sin</u> and <u>blasphemy</u> will be <u>forgiven men</u>, but the <u>blasphemy</u> <u>against the Spirit</u> will <u>not</u> be <u>forgiven men</u>."
