Baptized with Fire!

Luke 3:16-17

In Luke 3 we find four Baptisms: • John's • HS • Fire • Jesus'

Luke 3:16: <u>John</u> answered, saying to all, "I indeed <u>baptize</u> you with <u>water</u>; but <u>One</u> mightier than I is coming, <u>whose sandal strap I am not worthy to loose</u>. <u>He</u> will <u>baptize</u> you with the <u>Holy Spirit</u> and <u>fire</u>."

Some conclude that John is talking about <u>one baptism</u> here in our text. The <u>baptism</u> with the <u>Holy Spirit</u> and <u>fire</u>.

- Tongues of <u>fire</u> (Acts 2)
- Purified by <u>fire</u> (fiery trials)
- Lives set on fire (1 Thessalonians 5:19 do not guench the Holy Spirit)

There are **two problems** with this interpretation.

- 1. Acts 1:5: For John truly baptized with water, but <u>you</u> shall be <u>baptized with</u> <u>the Holy Spirit</u> not many <u>days</u> from now.
 - *Notice* Jesus doesn't include <u>and fire</u>. Why is that important? It speaks of a <u>separate</u> baptism.
- 2. Luke 3:16: John answered, saying to all, "I indeed baptize you with water; but One mightier than I is coming, whose sandal strap I am not worthy to loose. He will baptize you with the Holy Spirit and fire."
- Luke 3:17: <u>His</u> winnowing fan is in <u>His</u> hand, and <u>He</u> will thoroughly clean out <u>His</u> threshing floor, and gather the wheat into <u>His</u> barn; but the chaff <u>He</u> will burn with unquenchable <u>fire</u>.
 - Luke 3:17 is clearly talking about a separate <u>baptism</u> in which <u>Jesus</u> is going to baptize **unbelievers** with unquenchable fire.

There are two different baptisms at two different times in history.

The Baptism with the Holy Spirit began at Pentecost (Acts 2) at the birth of the church.

Luke 3:17 is talking about the <u>End Times</u> when <u>Jesus</u> is going to gather His church into His <u>barn</u> and then judge the unbelieving world by <u>fire</u>!

Luke 3:17: <u>His winnowing fan (fork)</u> is in <u>His hand</u>, and He will thoroughly clean out <u>His threshing floor</u>, and gather the **wheat** into <u>His barn</u>; but the **chaff** He will <u>burn</u> with <u>unquenchable fire</u>.

Q. Are you the <u>wheat</u> or the <u>chaff</u>? (Luke 3:17)

Psalm 1:1-4: <u>Blessed</u> is the man who <u>walks</u> not in the counsel of the ungodly, nor <u>stands</u> in the path of sinners, nor <u>sits</u> in the seat of the scornful; But his <u>delight</u> is in the <u>law of the Lord</u>, and in His law he <u>meditates day</u> and <u>night</u>. He shall be like a **tree** planted by the rivers of water, that brings forth its <u>fruit</u> in its season, whose leaf shall <u>not wither</u>; and <u>whatever he does shall prosper</u>. The <u>ungodly are not so</u>, but are like the **chaff** which the wind drives away.

Q. Are you the tree or the chaff of Psalm 1?

He will burn the chaff with unquenchable fire. (Luke 3:17)

Matthew 25:41: Then He will also say to those on the <u>left</u> hand, "<u>Depart from Me</u>, you <u>cursed</u>, into the <u>everlasting fire</u> prepared for the <u>devil</u> and <u>his angels.</u>"

Revelation 20:15: And <u>anyone</u> not found written in the <u>Book of Life</u> was cast into the <u>lake of fire</u>.
