A Rock Solid Life

Luke 6:39-49

Luke 6:39: And He spoke a <u>parable</u> to them.

1. The Blind Leading the Blind

Luke 6:39-40: And He spoke a <u>parable</u> to them: "Can <u>the blind lead the blind?</u> Will they not both fall into the ditch? A <u>disciple</u> is not above his <u>teacher</u>, but everyone who is <u>perfectly trained</u> will be <u>like his teacher</u>."

If <u>Jesus</u> is your teacher, you'll be like <u>Him</u>.

Here we're reading about blind Jewish teachers.

Matthew 23:24-26: <u>Blind guides</u>, who strain out a gnat and swallow a camel! Woe to you, scribes and Pharisees, <u>hypocrites</u>! For you cleanse the <u>outside</u> of the cup and dish, but <u>inside</u> they are full of extortion and self-indulgence. <u>Blind Pharisee</u>, first cleanse the <u>inside</u> of the cup and dish, that the <u>outside</u> of them may be clean also.

2 Corinthians 4:4: Whose minds the <u>god of this age</u> has <u>blinded</u>, who <u>do not believe</u>, lest the light of the gospel of the glory of Christ, who is the image of God, should shine on them.

Romans 11:25: For I do not desire, brethren, that you should be ignorant of this mystery, lest you should be wise in your own opinion, that <u>blindness</u> in <u>part</u> has happened to <u>Israel</u> until the <u>fullness of the Gentiles has come in</u>.

Acts 26:17-18: <u>Gentiles</u>...to <u>open their eyes</u>, in order to turn them from <u>darkness to light</u>, and from the <u>power of Satan to God</u>, that they may receive <u>forgiveness of sins</u> and an inheritance among those who are <u>sanctified</u> by <u>faith in Me</u>.

A different type of spiritual blindness - a second parable:

2. The Speck and the Plank

Luke 6:41-42: And why do you look at the <u>speck</u> in your brother's eye, but do not <u>perceive</u> the <u>plank</u> in your own eye? Or how can you say to your brother, "Brother, let me remove the <u>speck</u> that is in your eye," when you yourself do not see the <u>plank</u> that is in your own eye? <u>Hypocrite</u>! <u>First</u> remove the <u>plank</u> from your own eye, and then you will <u>see clearly</u> to remove the <u>speck</u> that is in your brother's eye.

3. A Good Tree and a Bad Tree

Luke 6:43-44: For a good tree does **not** bear <u>bad fruit</u>, nor does a <u>bad tree</u> bear <u>good fruit</u>. For every tree is known by its <u>own fruit</u>. For men do not gather <u>figs</u> from <u>thorns</u>, nor do they gather <u>grapes</u> from a <u>bramble bush</u>.

Galatians 5:22-23: But the <u>fruit</u> of the <u>Spirit</u> is <u>love</u>, <u>joy</u>, <u>peace</u>, <u>longsuffering</u>, <u>kindness</u>, <u>goodness</u>, <u>faithfulness</u>, <u>gentleness</u>, <u>self-control</u>.

- Fruit of the Spirit (Galatians 5:22)
- Good works (Colossians 1:10)
- Financial giving (Philippians 4:17)
- Leading others to Jesus (John 4:36)
- Holiness (Romans 6:22)
- Praise, the fruit of our lips (Hebrews 13:15)

Galatians 5:19-21: When you follow the desires of your sinful nature, the results are very clear: fornication, impurity, lustful pleasures, idolatry, sorcery, hostility, quarreling, jealousy, outbursts of anger, selfish ambition, dissension, division, envy, drunkenness, wild parties, and other sins like these. Let me tell you again, as I have before, that anyone living that sort of life will **not** inherit the Kingdom of God.

4. Good Treasure and Bad Treasure

Luke 6:45: A good man out of the good treasure of his heart brings forth good; and an evil man out of the evil treasure of his heart brings forth evil. For out of the abundance of the heart his mouth speaks.

What do you <u>treasure</u> in your heart - <u>good</u> or <u>evil</u>? A person's <u>speech</u> reveals what is truly in their <u>heart</u>.

Luke 6:46: But why do you call Me "Lord, Lord," and not do the things which I say?

It's possible to call Jesus your <u>Lord</u> and have it not be <u>true</u>.

Matthew 7:21-23: Not everyone who says to Me, "Lord, Lord," shall enter the kingdom of heaven, but he who does the will of My Father in heaven. Many will say to Me in that day, "Lord, Lord, have we not prophesied in Your name, cast out demons in Your name, and done many wonders in Your name?" And then I will declare to them, "I never knew you; depart from Me, you who practice lawlessness!"

5. A House and its Foundation

Luke 6:47-48: Whoever <u>comes to Me</u>, and <u>hears My sayings</u> and <u>does them</u>, I will show you whom he is like: He is like a man <u>building a house</u>, who <u>dug deep</u> and <u>laid the foundation on the rock</u>. And when the <u>flood arose</u>, the <u>stream beat vehemently</u> against that house, and could <u>not shake it</u>, for it was <u>founded on the rock</u>.

James 1:2-4: My brethren, <u>count it all joy</u> when you fall into various <u>trials</u>, knowing that the testing of your faith produces <u>patience</u>. But let patience have its perfect work, that you may be <u>perfect</u> (mature) and <u>complete</u>, <u>lacking nothing</u>.

Romans 5:3-4: We also <u>glory</u> in <u>tribulations</u>, knowing that tribulation produces <u>perseverance</u>; and perseverance, <u>character</u>; and character, <u>hope</u>.

The default during hard times is to ask, "why **me**?" Those who hope in Christ have the perspective "why **not** me?"

John 16:33: These things I have spoken to you, that <u>in Me</u> you may have <u>peace</u>. In the world you will have <u>tribulation</u>; but be of <u>good cheer</u> (take courage; be confident, certain, undaunted) I have overcome the world.

Luke 6:49: But he who <u>heard</u> and <u>did nothing</u> is like a man who <u>built a house on</u> <u>the earth without a foundation</u>, against which the <u>stream beat vehemently</u>; and <u>immediately it fell</u> and the <u>ruin</u> of that house was <u>great</u>.

Matthew 11:28-29: <u>Come to Me</u>, all you who labor and are heavy laden, and I will give you <u>rest</u>. Take My yoke upon you and learn from Me, for I am gentle and lowly in heart, and you will find <u>rest for your souls</u>.

John 7:37-38: If <u>anyone thirsts</u>, let him <u>come to Me</u> and drink. He who believes in Me, as the Scripture has said, out of his heart will flow <u>rivers of living water</u>.

John 5:39-40: You search the <u>Scriptures</u>, for in them you think you have eternal life; and these are they which <u>testify of Me</u>. But you are <u>not willing</u> to <u>come to Me</u> that you may have <u>life</u>.

2 Timothy 2:22: <u>Flee</u> also <u>youthful lusts</u>; but pursue <u>righteousness</u>, <u>faith</u>, <u>love</u>, <u>peace</u> <u>with those who call on the Lord out of a pure heart</u>.
