SMALL GROUP QUESTIONS

- Why was the tabernacle to be built?
- What did the tabernacle represent to the people of God?
- Where did the pattern for the tabernacle come from? Where did the materials for the tabernacle come from?
- What was kept in the ark of the covenant? What was their significance?
- Are there things that you keep and set apart for a special purpose? What are they and why do you continue to keep them?
- The phrase “mercy seat” also means propitiation. What is the significance of that in light of the incarnation of Jesus? (Romans 3:24-25, 1 John 2:2) Why do we need a mercy seat or propitiation?
- There was a thick veil in the tabernacle between the Holy of Holies and the Holy Place. Why was that?
- In Matthew 27:50-51 the gospel author says that the veil of the temple supernaturally tore from top to bottom concurrent with the death of Jesus. What is the significance of that?
- Hebrews 9:11-12 contrasts Jesus and the tabernacle. What observations do you see here?
- What is one thing that you understand about the tabernacle that can change the way you live?
