Bible study: Quick start guide

Observation: What does it say?

- Read the entire book or surrounding passages (before and after) at least one time.
- Read and re-read the specific passage you are studying. Don't stop.
- Determine the genre
- Determine the author
- Determine the setting and the audience
- Note helpful historical information. (What was going on in the world at the time of writing)
- Answer: Who? What? Where? Why? When? How?
- Look for God
 - Father, Son, or Spirit
 - Ways (activity that reveals Him)
 - Character
 - Words
- Look for/List:
 - Transitional words (But, then, therefore, because, however, etc.)
 - Key themes
 - Lists
 - Comparisons
 - Commands
 - Exhortations (encouragements, directions)
 - Warnings
 - Words that need clarifying/defining
- Write any questions

Interpretation: What does it mean?

- Re-read the sentences and passages/chapters before and after the passage.
- Re-read the passage you are studying
- Note the **context** of the passage.
- Note the **content**:
 - ➤ Mark/write Keywords or phrases. Define them.
 - ➤ Biblical theology: In light of the greater story look for themes that match God's story (kingdoms, offspring, blood, blessing, exodus or exiles, priests, glory, suffering, dwelling, etc.)
 - Consider how this passage connects to the Bible's overall flow and message and how it points to Christ and to the greater story of God in the Bible? (biblical theology)
 - > Systematic theology: Discern how this passage is important in the Bible such as key doctrines. Does it speak to holiness? Faith? Grace? Is there any area of doctrine I must consider? (holiness, the nature of man, the nature of God, the role of the Holy Spirit?
- <u>Consider</u>: Before consulting tools spend time considering what the author is trying to say in this passage. Let the Holy Spirit lead you in truth.
 - Be willing to sit in the hard passages if you feel uncomfortable or uncertain. God is okay with our struggles to understand. Consult study help <u>after</u> you have prayed through and considered the text.
 - What glimpses of the gospel are visible here? How does gospel truth give clarity to this passage?

Compare:

- Use cross-references (compare Scripture with Scripture)
- Is there a story or example or use elsewhere in the Bible?
- Are there multiple meanings based on context for this truth or these words?
- <u>Consult</u> maps, footnotes, trusted commentaries for hard to understand passages.
 - Ask- How does this passage fit into this book? The author's message of the entire book?
- Summarize in your own words.

Application: What does it mean to/for me?

- What is true about God? How does this truth relate to me/my family/mankind?
- What has the Holy Spirit prompted or exposed in me?
 - An action of obedience
 - A posture of worship
 - A truth to claim and cling to
 - A change in my life, behaviors, responses or perspective? Teachability.
 - A sin to confess
- A plan
 - How I will turn away from the sin I confessed?
 - How will I step toward obedience?
 - How will I live in grace to those around me in light of what I read?
