Blessed to Bring God's Saving Power to the Nations

UPWARDS – Growing in Our Relationship with God

1. Psalm 67:1-2 calls us to pray that God's ways may be known on earth and his saving power among all nations. What do these verses reveal about God's heart and desire for both his people and the nations to know, trust, and worship him?
2. According to Psalm 67:4, what does it mean that God “guides the nations”? What does this tell us about his sovereign rule over all peoples and nations?
3. Psalm 67:7 concludes with the declaration, “all the ends of the earth fear him.” How does this shape our understanding of God's desire for all peoples to fear and worship him? How should this truth influence the way we live?

INWARDS – Growing in Fellowship with One Another

4. How does Psalm 67:1 portray God's grace as the essential foundation for every blessing we receive? In what ways do we depend on God's grace each day?
5. How does the central section of Psalm 67 (vv. 3-5) emphasize the goal of worldwide worship? How should this shape and deepen your own worship of God?
6. Psalm 67:4 highlights that God rules with righteousness and justice. How can we learn to pray in a way that acknowledges God's eternal and unshakable rule over all human governments and authorities?

OUTWARDS – Reaching Those Around Us

7. The refrain in verses 3 and 5 calls for “all the peoples” to praise God. How does this universal call to worship challenge social barriers or other obstacles to our witness, and how should it shape our prayers for others?
8. How does the truth that we are “blessed to be a blessing” (Genesis 12:1-3) shape the way we pray for our family, friends, and others in our circles of influence?
9. In Psalm 67:6-7 we read, “God, our God, blesses us. May God bless us still, so that all the ends of the earth will fear him.” Why does the Psalm stress that God blesses his people first and then uses them as his witnesses to extend his grace to others?
