Main Idea

Psalm 105 calls God's people to remember His faithfulness, worship Him, seek His presence and strength, and tell others what He has done. Remembering God's promises and His saving work gives us reason to trust Him in difficult circumstances and to proclaim His goodness.

Discussion Questions

UPWARDS - Growing in Relationship with God

1. What does Psalm 105:1–5 show us about the kind of relationship God wants us to have with Him?
2. Psalm 105 calls God's people to remember what He has done. How can remembering God's faithfulness change the way we respond when our present circumstances are difficult or confusing?
3. The sermon reminds us of what God has done through Jesus—His death and resurrection, forgiveness, new life, adoption into God's family, and the gift of the Holy Spirit. Which of these truths gives you a reason to worship or trust God today?

INWARDS - Growing in Fellowship with One Another

4. Psalm 105:2 says, "Tell of all his wonderful acts." How can sharing stories of God's faithfulness with one another strengthen the faith of a small group or church?
5. The sermon describes talking about God's works as "table talk with substance and power." What could help conversations about God and His faithfulness become a more natural part of our relationships with family and Christian friends?
6. When someone in our church community is discouraged or struggling to see what God is doing, how can we help them remember God's character and promises without ignoring the difficulty they are facing?

OUTWARDS - Reaching Those Around Us

7. Psalm 105:1 says, "Make known among the nations what he has done." What does this invitation look like for followers of Jesus living in a multicultural community like Kitchener?
8. What is one story of God's goodness or faithfulness that you could share with someone who doesn't know Jesus?
9. Think of one person in your life who may be open to exploring questions about faith. What simple step could you take this week to invite them to Alpha or begin a spiritual conversation with them?
