

## Scripture

**Luke 14:1-6(NKJV)** <sup>1</sup>Now it happened, as He went into the house of one of the rulers of the Pharisees to eat bread on the Sabbath, that they **watched Him closely**. <sup>2</sup> And behold, there was a certain man before Him who had **dropsy**. <sup>3</sup> And Jesus, answering, spoke to the lawyers and Pharisees, saying, "Is it lawful to heal on the Sabbath?" <sup>4</sup> **But they kept silent**. And He took *him* and healed him, and let him go. <sup>5</sup> Then He answered them, saying, "Which of you, having a donkey or an ox that has fallen into a pit, will not immediately pull him out on the Sabbath day?" <sup>6</sup> And they could not **answer Him** regarding these things.

**Luke 14:9-10(NKJV)** <sup>9</sup> and he who invited you and him come and say to you, 'Give place to this man,' and then you begin with **shame** to take the lowest place. <sup>10</sup> But when you are invited, go and sit down in the lowest place, so that when he who invited you comes he may say to you, 'Friend, go up higher.' Then you will have glory in the presence of those who sit at the table with you.

**Luke 14:12-14(NKJV)** <sup>12</sup> Then He also said to him who invited Him, "When you give a dinner or a supper, do not ask your friends, your brothers, your relatives, nor rich neighbors, lest they also invite you back, and you be repaid. <sup>13</sup> But when you give a feast, invite *the poor, the maimed, the lame, the blind*. <sup>14</sup> And you will be blessed, because they cannot repay you; for you shall be repaid at the resurrection of the just."
