


One talent seems to have been equivalent to 6,000 denarii, or 6,000 days worth of wages for a day labourer. This makes the talent worth about \$1,000,000 dollars in today's

### When Jesus says "talent" here, he means the <u>tasks</u>, <u>abilities</u>, endowments and <u>opportunities</u> bequeathed to his disciples, and what they do

with such opportunities.



# His servants are to complete the tasks he's given them, using the abilities and endowments and opportunities he's given them, thereby multiplying his investment.



#### The Master is not concerned with who made the most of what he gave them, but rather what they did with what he gave them.

## Maybe you don't have "5 talents" or "2 talents" worth of abilities, opportunities, endowments, and tasks. But if you've got <u>one</u>, you are a spiritual millionaire.
