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The context: covenant renewal at Shechem



Joshua's charge to the leaders Joshua 23

- Vs 6 be strong and don't deviate from the book of law of Moses
- Vs 7 don't assimilate with the wrong people, and do not chase after their gods
- Vs 12 don't intermarry with these people
- Vs 13 warning, if you do assimilate with them and you do participate in idolatry, these people will be a snare and trap for you
- Vs 13 The cost for compromise will destroy you
- Vs 14-16 Remember God's faithfulness and his justice



Covenant renewal at Shechem Joshua 24:1-15

- Why Shechem and not Shiloh?
- The history of God's greatness
- The terms of the covenant: God chose His people, God his people, God blessed His people with an inheritance
- and seeking other gods

delivered His people, God protected His people, God saved

 God gave his people a choice: either serve Him, according to His terms, or expect to reap the consequences for idolatry



The response of the people **Joshua 24:16–28**

- Vs 18 the people: we will serve the Lord, for He is our God
- Vs 19 Joshua challenges, the people
- Vs 20 the people: we will serve the Lord
- Vs 22 Joshua explains the terms of a covenant relationship
- Vs 23 Joshua commanded them to put away foreign gods and open their hearts to God of Israel
- Vs 24 the people: VOWED to serve God, a national oath of obedience
- Vs 25 Joshua made covenant with God
- Vs 26 Joshua set up a stone to be a witness



The apostle Pauls charge to leaders at Rome Acts 28:17-31

- He gives them a history lesson
- He references both the law of Moses and the prophets
- He preaches the kingdom to them
- They did not receive him or his message
- He challenges them with a prophecy from the book of Isaiah
- He makes it clear to them if they do not choose Christ, then the gentile nations will hear it
- They disputed his words, but he continued to freely preach the gospel until his time was finished



Jesus challenged his disciples and followers John 6:60-71 Jesus challenge the crowd, and his disciples

- John 8:39–47 Jesus confronts the Pharisees
- John 13:36–38 Jesus confronts Peter, who promised to lay down his life for Jesus
- Revelation 3:14–22 Jesus confronts the lukewarm church at Laodicea
- Are the words of Jesus too harsh?
