The State of the Nation

Judges 6: 1 - 10

- The fifth cycle of rebellion
- Israel's attempts to make peace with gators rather than remove them
- Evil: doing what is right in our own eyes
- Evil always looks beautiful before it turns ugly
- Cycles of rebellion for nations do not happen overnight
- God's method of correction is consistent
- God always turns His people over to their enemies
- The midnight to send it upon them like Locust at harvest time
- Don't cry for help until things get too bad



The Calling of Gideon

Judges 6:11 - 16

- No means, no money, no status
- Nameless, faceless
- Why is all of this bad stuff happening to us?
- Gideon's identity issue
- Our identity is wrapped up in what we do
- Ask someone, who are you? And they will tell you what they do.
- Gideon is called to be a judge/deliverer
- His assignment is to purge the community of idolatry

Gideons Encounter with God

Judges 6:17-24

- Face-to-face with God
- The Old Testament version of anointing, when the Holy Spirit comes upon someone or covers a man like clothing
- The anointing gave him an ability to do miracles and to be exceptionally brave

Gideon's First Assignment

Judges 6:25-32

- Tear down the idols of Baal and Asherah
- Courageous obedience
- Let the gods defend themselves
- Syncretism: mixture of cultures until they are blended and unrecognizable
- Example: homosexuality normalized in Christian churches

Gideon is Annointed by the Holy Spirit

Judges 6:33-40

- The fleece understandable but not necessary
- Gideon tested God two times
- Seeking signs is a symptom of insecurity
- Jesus made it clear that it was wrong to seek signs

God Tested Gideon

Judges 7:1–8

- Gideon started out with 32,000 men
- 22,000 men deserted him because they were afraid
- 10,000 remained and God sifted the group down to 300
- The brook test: those that lapped the water passed the test
- The remnant: 1 % of the forces remain to fight
- Their enemies 135,000 in number
- 400 to1
- 465 million Arabs vs 15 million Jews in the world

Warfare Worship

Judges 7:9–25

- The prophetic dream
- Gideons worship
- A sword for the Lord and for Gideon!
- Worship created chaos for the enemy

Gideon's Leadership Attacked

Judges 8:1–21

Ephraimites: watched the battle unfold, but did not commit, that they were not being used enough, they wanted credit they didn't deserve

Sukkoth and Peniel: betrayed Gideon because they did not want to give up their comfort to be a part of the conflict

Gideons discipline: too harsh?

King Gideon?

Judges 8:22-28

- Gideon refused to allow the people to make him a king
- The Lord will rule over you
- The ephod (garment worn by priest) turns into an idol
- The man of God should guard himself from competing with God
