Luke 24:1-12

1. How do you find answers when you have questions? From where do you get your information? How does this relate to seeking truth and finding answers?
2. Jesus spent 3 years proclaiming truth to his disciples and they often did not understand. How are we doing at understanding/applying the things Jesus taught? Dissect these truths as spoken by Jesus:
 - 9:48 Then he said to them, "Whoever welcomes this little child in my name welcomes me; and whoever welcomes me welcomes the one who sent me. For it is the one who is least among you all who is the greatest."
 - 19:10 "For the Son of Man came to seek and to save the lost."
 - 23:34 Jesus said, "Father, forgive them, for they do not know what they are doing."
 - Attached is a long compilation of some of Jesus teachings for your consideration.
3. How significant is it that so many people have tried to disprove this truth? How does our culture try to disprove the truth of Christ's life, death and resurrection?
4. How has Christ's resurrection power been demonstrated in you? Or put another way, how have you been transformed by Christ? Read Rom 6:10,11 How do I experience this truth in my daily life? Memorize Galatians 2:20 as a group.

5:24 But I want you to know that the Son of Man has authority on earth to forgive sins.”

5:31-32 “It is not the healthy who need a doctor, but the sick. 32 I have not come to call the righteous, but sinners to repentance.”

6:5 “The Son of Man is Lord of the Sabbath.”

8:25 “Where is your faith?”

8:21 He replied, “My mother and brothers are those who hear God’s word and put it into practice.”

9:22-27 And he said, “The Son of Man must suffer many things and be rejected by the elders, the chief priests and the teachers of the law, and he must be killed and on the third day be raised to life.” Then he said to them all: “Whoever wants to be my disciple must deny themselves and take up their cross daily and follow me. 24 For whoever wants to save their life will lose it, but whoever loses their life for me will save it. 25 What good is it for someone to gain the whole world, and yet lose or forfeit their very self? 26 Whoever is ashamed of me and my words, the Son of Man will be ashamed of them when he comes in his glory and in the glory of the Father and of the holy angels.

27 “Truly I tell you, some who are standing here will not taste death before they see the kingdom of God.”

9:44 “Listen carefully to what I am about to tell you: The Son of Man is going to be delivered into the hands of men.

9:48 Then he said to them, “Whoever welcomes this little child in my name welcomes me; and whoever welcomes me welcomes the one who sent me. For it is the one who is least among you all who is the greatest.”

9:60 Jesus said to him, “Let the dead bury their own dead, but you go and proclaim the kingdom of God.”

9:62 Jesus replied, “No one who puts a hand to the plow and looks back is fit for service in the kingdom of God.”

11:39 Then the Lord said to him, “Now then, you Pharisees clean the outside of the cup and dish, but inside you are full of greed and wickedness.

12:8 “I tell you, whoever publicly acknowledges me before others, the Son of Man will also acknowledge before the angels of God.

12:51 Do you think I came to bring peace on earth? No, I tell you, but division.

13:2 Jesus answered, “Do you think that these Galileans were worse sinners than all the other Galileans because they suffered this way? 3 I tell you, no! But unless you repent, you too will all perish. 4 Or those eighteen who died when the tower in Siloam fell on them—do you think they were more guilty than all the others living in Jerusalem? 5 I tell you, no! But unless you repent, you too will all perish.”

13:30 Indeed there are those who are last who will be first, and first who will be last.”

13:35 Look, your house is left to you desolate. I tell you, you will not see me again until you say, ‘Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord.

14:11 For all those who exalt themselves will be humbled, and those who humble themselves will be exalted.”

14:25 Large crowds were traveling with Jesus, and turning to them he said: 26 “If anyone comes to me and does not hate father and mother, wife and children, brothers and sisters—yes, even their own life—such a person cannot be my disciple.

14: 27 And whoever does not carry their cross and follow me cannot be my disciple.

16:13 “No one can serve two masters. Either you will hate the one and love the other, or you will be devoted to the one and despise the other. You cannot serve both God and money.”

17:2 It would be better for them to be thrown into the sea with a millstone tied around their neck than to cause one of these little ones to stumble. 3 So watch yourselves.

17:25 But first he must suffer many things and be rejected by this generation.

17:33 Whoever tries to keep their life will lose it, and whoever loses their life will preserve it.

18:17 Truly I tell you, anyone who will not receive the kingdom of God like a little child will never enter it.”

18:25 Indeed, it is easier for a camel to go through the eye of a needle than for someone who is rich to enter the kingdom of God.”

18:27 “What is impossible with man is possible with God.”

19:10 For the Son of Man came to seek and to save the lost.”

19: 46 “It is written,” he said to them, “‘My house will be a house of prayer’; but you have made it ‘a den of robbers.’”

20:25 He said to them, “Then give back to Caesar what is Caesar’s, and to God what is God’s.”

21:17 Everyone will hate you because of me.

21:33 Heaven and earth will pass away, but my words will never pass away.

22:67 Jesus answered, “If I tell you, you will not believe me, 68 and if I asked you, you would not answer. 69 But from now on, the Son of Man will be seated at the right hand of the mighty God.”

23:34 Jesus said, “Father, forgive them, for they do not know what they are doing.”

24:7 ‘The Son of Man must be delivered over to the hands of sinners, be crucified and on the third day be raised again.’”

24:25 He said to them, “How foolish you are, and how slow to believe all that the prophets have spoken! 26 Did not the Messiah have to suffer these things and then enter his glory?”
