1. Familiarize Yourself With the Passage and the Gospel

a. Read Matthew 10:3; Mark 2:14, 3:18, 15:40; Luke 6:15; Acts 1:14

2. Introduction to the Passage (Feel free to use this as a reference guide as you discuss the passage)

<u>Historical/Literary Context</u>: Who is Thaddeus, or also called Judas the son of James? Judas is most likely his Jewish name and is specifically called "Judas, not Iscariot" in John 14:22 in order to distinguish him from the traitor in the group. Thaddeus is his Greek name and derives from a Hebrew word that means "female breast" which could refer to his warm character or personality.¹ Tradition and outside Biblical literature tells of him having a ministry in Edessa where he preached, healed, and converted people to Christianity. Most believe that it was there that he died as a martyr, by possible crucifixion. The only passage in the New Testament that records something he said is in John 14:22, "Lord, how is it that you will manifest yourself to us, and not to the world?" From these questions, Jesus ventures on a long discourse about the role of the Holy Spirit, who is the one that will manifest Jesus' will and mission to the Apostles.

3. Questions About the Passage

- a. In and around Judas' question in verse 22, Jesus spends a lot of time talking about the Holy Spirit (John 14:15-31). What are some things that Jesus says about the Holy Spirit and His ministry?
- b. How is Jesus' answer to Judas' question a comfort in the midst of what lies ahead?
- c. John 15:12-13 discusses true love in a friendship. How does Judas embody this as he follows Jesus?

4. From the Passage to Life

- a. What things about the Holy Spirit in this discussion specifically help you in your Christian life (John 14:15-31)?
- b. The world is filled with troubles. What kind of peace is Jesus talking about (John 14:27)? How is Jesus' peace specifically helping you now in a trial or trouble?
- c. Where is the priority of God's love in your life, and do you prioritize keeping his word (John 14:23-24)? Is there anything in your life that is competing with your love for the Father and the Son?
