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#### 1. Familiarize Yourself With the Passage

- a. Read Exodus 19
- b. Read and study the context around the law
- c. Read and study the story/narrative around the law

#### Introduction to the Passage (Feel free to use this as a reference guide as you discuss the passage)

Grace in the Old Testament: Often times Christians hold an unhealthy dichotomy between the OT and NT saving that the Old Covenant was based on legalism or law and the New Covenant is based on grace. While there are differences between the two, this statement is not completely accurate. In Exodus 19:4 God is grounding the covenant on an act of grace when he says, "I bore you on eagle's wings and brought you to my myself." God performed the miracles in Egypt prior to Israel ever performing one act of obedience. Notice how grace is motivating obedience in the covenant. Further, verses 5-6 are commonly understood in this way, "Now therefore, if you will indeed obey my voice and keep my covenant, [then] you shall be my treasured possession among all peoples..." However, it is better to understand it this way, "Now therefore, if you will indeed obey my voice and keep my covenant, [and be] my treasured possession among all peoples, for all the earth is mine; and [then] you shall be to me a kingdom of priests and a holy nation." <sup>2</sup> Notice the security of the Israelites to be God's people is not grounded on their obedience. Their obedience guarantees the privileges of the covenant and not their position in the covenant. The issue in Exodus 19:4-6 is not will they have a covenant relationship with God based on their obedience, but what fruit will be the outcome of their covenant relationship. Grace was inherent in the Old Covenant as a foundation for the better covenant to come under Jesus Christ.

#### 3. Questions about the Passage

- a. What does it mean that Moses consecrated the people and then the priests consecrated themselves to the Lord?
- b. What do you think about the answer that Israel gave to Moses? Would you have answered differently or the same (v. 8)? Do you think that the people had a prideful sense of their ability to keep it or were looking for the blessing rather than a relationship with God? (Note the fact that the worship of the golden calf happened a few chapters later and the history of the Israelite people).

- c. What do the images of smoke, fire, thunder, and lightning cause you to think about in regard to the nature of God?
- d. The Israelites approached God at Sinai with terror and were kept at a distance from God. How can we approach God differently in the New Covenant (Hebrews 12:18-24; 4:14-16)?

#### 4. From the Passage to Life

- a. As you think about having a reverent fear of God, what does it look like to work out your life/salvation with fear and trembling (Philippians 2:12; 1 Peter 1:17)? How does this work out in the church corporately?
- b. How do you take time each day to cleanse yourself before the Lord or before corporate worship as you are growing in your sanctification (2 Corinthians 7:1; 1 John 1:9)? What is the condition for intimate fellowship with God according to 2 Corinthians 6:17-18?
- c. The People of Israel seemed to answer Moses quite quickly for various reasons. How do you depend on God in your daily life to live in obedience to God? What was a time in your life when you depended on God, and how was he faithful? How do we do this corporately as a church since the context is about corporate Israel?
- d. How has Jesus been a faithful mediator to you in your life from the time you first received Jesus to now as you have been growing in Christ?
