He was very much a part of the Unity Community and Unity AR Presbyterian Church, just as his ancestors, who were a deep part of the fabric of its history for decades. William was active in the life of the church, attending Sunday School, evening youth groups, Vacation Bible School, and Bonclarken retreats. He was also a member of Boy Scouts, which was sponsored by the church. His lifelong love of camping and fishing made him a proficient Boy Scout culminating in earning the rank of Eagle Scout. William attended and graduated from Buford High School where he met his best friend, Brenda Walters. He and Brenda were married and lived in Tennessee while he attended and graduated from Nashville Auto Diesel College. Soon after his graduation, William was drafted into the United States Army, where he served in the infantry and was in imminent danger. He was proud of serving his country. Upon return home, he and Brenda settled in Unity Community where their two children, Tonya and Darin, were born. He was a devoted father and husband. He greatly enjoyed his family time. William worked for Springs Industries as a supervisor in the transportation department. William was a “jack of all trades”. He was proficient and meticulous in auto repair, wood working, and building. His work shop and cars were also organized and immaculate. Over his lifetime, William owned several pets, and while loving all of them, his two favorite were his mixed breed dog, Short Cake, and his beautiful cat, Ruby! He was always faithful to his church, serving as a Deacon and Elder. He and his family rarely missed church and church related activities. In later years, as his grandchildren were born, he enjoyed spending time with each one. “POP POP” took great pride in granddaughters, Kayleigh, Avery, and Aubrey, and his grandson and namesake, Will. William will forever be remembered for his kind, gentle ways. He was loving and loved. He had a servant’s heart!
