*** Reprint from early spring***

In our last "From Our Corner", I reminisced about an incident that occurred during one of our Women's Morning Bible Study Group almost 50 years ago. Since then several people made the comment that reading about the honey triggered memories of similar childhood experiences. I was sharing this with two of my West Virginia cousins with whom I shared several weeks during school vacations with exchange visits. My cousin, Pam, asked me to write about the summer of our mud pie bakery. The week of the "PIE BAKE OFF", I happened to be visiting Ellen and Pam in Fayetteville, WVA. We were ages 6, 7 and 9, and we enjoyed playing in their play room which was a part of a back yard shed. Ellen and Pam had been collecting small round tin cans used for pantry tuna and salmon. That week, we decided that we would have this "pretend bakery business ". We began to make several dozen mud pies, but they were not pretty. We wanted them to look like chocolate merengue pies. I remembered a school Christmas project where the teacher showed us how to whip Ivory Flakes with a tiny bit of water into a fluffy spread to cover our paper mache snowman. Aunt Edna had a new box of the Ivory Flakes and we "borrowed" some without asking and presto... we had beautiful merengue pies. We realized that a bakery might have birthday cakes so they should have colored frosting. Aunt Edna's laundry room also provided us "bluing" which was used in the rinse water to make bed linens and such bright white. We found by adding this bluing to our merengue, we had beautiful blue birthday frosting, and all was well until... Aunt Edna wanted to do the week's laundry before we packed for me to return to Covington, Virginia. We had used all of the Ivory Flakes and most of the bluing! When questioned, we led Aunt Edna to our bakery and proudly showed her our pies and cakes. She just smiled and shook her head. Last week as we cousins remembered our fun, it also dawned on us that back then, the laundry products we had used, probably made a dent in the family budget and also, Aunt Edna did not drive... a REAL inconvenience living in the country!
