FROM OUR CORNER

Some of our church family might not be aware that Phonzo Starnes stepped down as Unity Cemetery Manager, if you missed being at the Memorial Association Meeting that took place in the sanctuary on August 24, 2025, as we celebrated the 150th Anniversary of our church. Phonzo has been a diligent care giver of our cemetery grounds for more than ten years. This job entails many hours of work in several areas. A major responsibility of the cemetery manager is to "lay out grave sites" before grave diggers move in to "open" a grave. As we all know, death has no respect for weather conditions. This means that the manager is often in extreme weather: summer heat, winter cold, snow, rain, and sleet. The manager is required to be present when monuments are placed. That beautiful fountain requires upkeep. The old fountain required lots of maintenance as it aged and deteriorated. Water purification is AWAYS a priority when the temperatures are high and there are long spells of heavy rain which cause the growth of algae. When we have periods of extreme cold the fountain needs to be drained. At one point Phonzo cleaned all of the tombstones to get the mildew stains off. He has always been generous of acknowledging the hard work of Tim Hallman as he mows and weed eats. Phonzo and Richard worked well together and enjoyed much camaraderie which involved lots of laughter and surely some shared feelings of frustration at times. There was also one afternoon when Phonzo and I stood, looking down at Richard as he lay on the ground with a seven-hundred-pound tombstone on top of him. The two of us could NOT lift the stone, and were helpless. Richard was able to gradually dig enough ground under himself and work his way out. He was bruised but not seriously hurt. The three of us concluded there was an angel in the garden that afternoon! I have heard visitors comment many times that our cemetery is one of the best kept and most beautiful in this area. So, the next time we stop to admire the peace and serenity of this setting we need to offer a prayer of thanks for the leadership Phonzo provided over the years and time he gave. "Well done good and faithful servant!"
