Last week I was blessed to be at Bonclarken with Richard and Charles for Synod. We stayed at Unity Dwelling (our church owned cottage on the Conference Grounds info for our newer members). I had more time than usual to enjoy the quiet comfort of the house there. As I walked through the rooms, I had memories of the people, of laughter, of spiritual growth, and always wonderful fellowship. At the cottage our young people are frozen in time, forever young. Our older members, who have gone to be with the Lord, seem to linger there, supervising teens, cooking three meals a day during conferences, creating a family like atmosphere at meals and in the evenings after Chapel. I smiled as I remembered the first night we stayed at the cottage (bought in June of 1978). The boys were sleeping downstairs, and the girls were upstairs with Aunt Mildred and me. We were all settled in for the night, when one of the girls decided to take a shower. The basement was not finished and nicely furnished, as it is today. The guys were in sleeping bags on the floor. When the shower was turned on upstairs the water POURED down on the boys. They were drenched. The plumber had forgotten to reattach the drain line! After a change of clothes, the boys moved upstairs and slept in the great room using the sofas and the floor. Back in those days, we had a clothesline in the backyard which was put to good use, the next day, to dry sleeping bags and pajamas! Our guys were great sports and laughed about their mid-night shower for years.
