Pastoral Pondering

Jonah

"The word reached the king of Nineveh, and he arose from his throne, removed his robe, covered himself with sackcloth, and sat in ashes."

Jonah 3:6

I just love moments studying in the Scriptures where the picture of the Gospel just jumps off the page. Thursday evenings the men have been going through Jonah. I've so enjoyed camping out on this verse for a bit.

Chapter 3 begins just as chapter 1. God commands Jonah to go and preach against the city of Nineveh, Israel's enemy. After God commands Jonah the first time, he flees the opposite direction and boards a ship, and you know the story, but the second time Jonah obeys. He goes to the city of Nineveh and begins to call out against them of a coming judgment where in 40 days the entire city would be overturned because of their evil ways.

Much to the readers' surprise and likely Jonah's, before he is even able to complete his mission and travel through the whole city, everyone from the greatest to the least responds by **believing God!** Praise the Lord for His work in the hearts of His enemies. The people then proceed to display their repentance by fasting and putting on sackcloth. This repentance is as miraculous as Jonah's life being preserved in the belly of a fish!

The next verse jumps off the page. It describes the response of the king of Nineveh in a neat chiasm.

"...and he arose from his throne, removed his robe, covered himself with sackcloth, and sat in ashes."

In a kingdom, the king represents the people of his kingdom. Where the heart of the king goes, so will the people. This is a beautiful picture of a great and mighty king who humbles himself. He got up from his throne, relinquishing, for a moment, his kingly duties. He takes off his royal wear which is a display of his kingly glory. He covers himself with sackcloth, making himself lowly like everyone else in the kingdom. Lastly, he sat down in ashes having humbled himself in the most complete way, to the dust of the earth, "for you are dust and to dust you shall return." (Genesis 3:19). This foreign pagan king did what very few kings in Israel ever did when confronted with sin. That is until THE true King of Israel would come.

Philippians 2:5-8, "... though he was in the form of God, did not count equality with God a thing to be grasped, but emptied himself, by taking the form of a servant, being born in the likeness of men. And being found in human form, he humbled himself by becoming obedient to the point of death, even death on a cross."

Do you see the connection? The Son of God, the king of the universe, the one who is in the heavens, The Lord of glory arises from His throne in heaven, and empties himself of this heavenly glory by taking off his kingly robes which display his majesty and splendor, and clothes himself in human flesh (sackcloth) by becoming man. He sits down upon the dust of the earth, dwelling amongst those of the dust as a man of sorrows, well acquainted with grief.

Christ humbled himself for the sake of and on behalf of His own enemies because he so loved the

world!!!! That's you and I, brothers and sisters. From the highest glory, the Son of God humbled himself to the lowest low, taking upon himself our sin and dying, even to death on the cross. As the Scripture says, "For our sake he made him to be sin who knew no sin, so that in him we might become the righteousness of God."

2 Corinthians 5:21.

The humbling of the king of Nineveh did have great effect on the people of Nineveh but not a permanent one. But the humbling of the Son of God has a permanent effect on His people, transforming them into new creations. For Jesus did not remain in the ash heap, but arose from death, (in the words of the book of Jonah, from the belly of Sheol) being vomited out because death could not hold him and the grave could not keep him. Jesus arose from death victorious over sin, having paid the price for our sin and securing for those who call upon his name forgiveness, righteousness, and eternal life.

"Therefore God has highly exalted him and bestowed on him the name that is above every name, so that at the name of Jesus every knee should bow, in heaven and on earth and under the earth, and every tongue confess that Jesus Christ is Lord to the glory of God the Father." Philippians 2:9-11

The chiasm of this story continues in Jesus, for our King arose from the dust, put back on his kingly garments full of glory, honor, and splendor and is now seated at the right hand of the Father to rule and reign forever and ever over all creation. There, however, is one caveat. He doesn't take off human flesh, but remains forever the God- Man as a perfect and righteous representative of His people who we will one day see in the flesh face to face!

Oh brothers and sisters, delight in these beautiful Old Testament pictures, shadows, and types of our Lord Jesus. Remember, all of the Scripture testifies of Christ Jesus, and when you see Him, it adds so much more depth and richness and beauty to our understanding of the Gospel, leading us to worship and praise Him all the more.


