Blessed Assurance: A Brief Testimony

I grew up in a Christian family that attended church faithfully. That's a blessing I do not take for granted. It shaped the majority of the foundational thinking of my life. It means I have always lived with the conviction that God exists, that the Lord Jesus Christ is the only way of salvation, that there are places called "heaven" and "hell," that the Bible is the Word of God, and there is a difference between right and wrong.

Those convictions did not mean, however that they always directly affected my values and behavior. One factor was that the church we attended did not have a clear understanding of the perfection of the work of Jesus on the cross. The doctrine that especially affected me was the idea that my salvation depended primarily on me and my efforts to be faithful. If there was something lacking in my efforts, it indicated that I had drifted away. No one would say I was no longer saved, but that implication always hung over my head. I was a good boy, but emotional appeals and warnings about the seriousness of our walk with the Lord did nothing to equip me to face the enemy's attacks meant to turn me completely away from the Lord. My entire youth was affected by this uncertainty.

Everything changed one night when I found myself in a situation where I had an encounter with God. This was something I had never experienced. I was accustomed to emotional appeals to accept Jesus, but on that night, I met the Lord in reality. There was only one thing to do: I must turn my entire being and life over to the Lord who had a direct interest in my life. I did, and I knew I had experienced something new and real.

Of course, I still had those years of teaching that emphasized my works and the fragility of a relationship with the Lord. But thankfully, God had a different plan for me. A friend gave me a book.

It was a workbook written for new believers to give them a basis in the doctrine of salvation. Due to my history in a Christian home, most of what I read was familiar. "Familiar" often means "not very interesting," and that's what much of it was. Until I encountered three verses. The verses were 1 John 5:11-13:

And this is the testimony, that God gave us eternal life, and this life is in His Son. Whoever has the Son has life; whoever does not have the Son of God does not have life. I write these things to you who believe in the name of the Son of God, that you may know that you have eternal life.

I read those verses and one word literally jumped off the page. (I hate it when people misuse the word, "literally," so I better restate what happened.) It was as if the word had jumped off the page into my eyes, into my brain, and into my heart. I was stunned and overwhelmed with something I had never heard in countless sermons and Sunday School lessons. I was filled with joy, wonder, and security. The word was "know." I had never been taught that I could know that I had eternal life. In fact, I was taught that I could not know. I had hoped like crazy that I had eternal life, but deep down inside there was the fear that I either did not have it or that I could lose it. The Bible clearly contradicted that dangerous teaching.

All the things I learned at home and church did not give me what that word, "know," suddenly provided. Knowing that I actually had an eternal and certain relationship with the One True Living God formed a confidence that *really* shaped all of life for me. Almost 56 years later, I am the man I am by God's grace and faithfulness. And I can confidently say, "I know I belong to the Lord forever."

"Blessed assurance! Jesus is mine!" Is He yours?
