

Pastoral Pondering

BLESSEDNESS

"Blessed are those who are persecuted for righteousness' sake, for theirs is the *Kingdom of heaven.*" ~Matthew 5:10

This is the final blessing pronounced by Jesus in what is known by many as the "beatitudes." That word "beatitude" simply means "blessedness." The word "blessed" here can also be translated "happy" with the understanding that it is a happiness that transcends our moment-by-moment experiences of life. Instead, blessedness is to be understood as an eternal and abiding happiness, contentment or joy based on that which transcends our current experience but is rooted and grounded in eternal reality.

That said, to lay some groundwork, Jesus says to the multitude listening to Him then, and now to you and me today "blessed are those who are persecuted." If there were ever a time when there seems to be a paradox (a seeming contradiction) this would be one of them. Jesus further expands on what that persecution may look like in vs 11. That is to be *"reviled, persecuted, and spoken evil of."* Now I don't know about you but if I'm reviled, persecuted and spoken evil of, I don't feel in that moment especially happy or "blessed." Yet Jesus goes on in vs 12 to tell those who experience such things to *"rejoice and be exceedingly glad.*" How can Jesus say such things? Even to the point of commanding rejoicing during persecution, when we know that very persecution may bring about emotional and for some physical pain even unto death. How is that Jesus can call this a "blessed" condition?

Well, the answer lies in what was purposely left of this writing until now (I hope you've noticed). That is, I have selectively been quoting Jesus' words (as recorded by Matthew) but not all of them, because Jesus used *Qualifying* words in this section of scripture that bring definition to the text that isn't only helpful but is altogether necessary. Without the qualifiers such as "for righteousness' sake" or "falsely for My (Jesus) sake" we end up with our own imaginations defining what the state of "blessed" persecution is (usually one of self-justification).

The persecution Jesus is talking about is by definition and cause inseparable from our union with Christ. If we look back just a few verses to vs 6 we see the same "blessed" people are those who are *"hungering and thirsting (starving and parched) for righteousness*" of which it is promised that they will be filled (to overflowing). That word **righteousness** is the same word that is in our text we are talking about. That overflowing righteousness with which Christ fills us doesn't simply remain hidden in us, or between us and God, but rather inescapably spills out into every facet of our lives. Transforming us, molding us, shaping us (our actions and attitudes) into the image of the one who has purchased us, that is Jesus Christ. So, when Jesus says, *"blessed are you when you are persecuted*"

for righteousness' sake" He is not saying blessed are you when you sin (and bear consequences), or do something stupid, or are being persecuted for politics sake, but instead what qualifies as blessedness is very narrow in scope. It is for **"righteousness' sake**" and that is spelled out in no uncertain terms when Jesus continues to say, *"Blessed are you when they revile you and persecute you and say all kinds of evil*

against you falsely for My sake." It is the falseness of the accusation that is one of the qualifiers in this blessing. In plain and simple terms Jesus pronounces Eternal happiness on those who give no offence of their own but rather are maligned and persecuted on account of Christ and His commands. And so, Christ and what He has commanded of us (to cease from sin, to walk in righteousness, to be heralds of the good news and by implication the bad news of the just judgment of God) becomes the stone of stumbling and the Rock of offence. When we are persecuted for walking after Christ and not being ashamed of Jesus, then we are to "rejoice and be exceedingly glad (why?) for great is your reward in heaven" and "for yours is the kingdom of heaven." And not only great is our reward but Jesus goes on to explain that we are following the same pattern of those who faithfully walked before us. "For they persecuted the prophets who were before you." And more than that Jesus doesn't call us to do anything that He himself didn't do, but rather we are to with great and abiding joy, follow our master who "when reviled did not revile in return; when He suffered, He did not threaten, but committed Himself to Him who judges righteously" ~1 Peter 2:23

Looking unto the Captain of our salvation, and to the Eternal Kingdom.


