Pastoral Pondering

WHOLLY HOLY

"From the throne came flashes of lightning, and rumblings and peals of thunder, and before the throne were burning seven torches of fire, which are the seven spirits of God, and before the throne there was as it were a sea of glass, like crystal.

And around the throne, on each side of the throne, are four living creatures, full of eyes in front and behind: the first living creature like a lion, the second living creature like an ox, the third living creature with the face of a man, and the fourth living creature like an eagle in flight. And the four living creatures, each of them with six wings, are full of eyes all around and within, and day and night they never cease to say,

'Holy, holy, holy, is the Lord God Almighty, who was and is and is to come!'" Revelation 4:5-8.

The book of Revelation is awesome! I don't mean "awesome" in the overused, casual sense which has made the word mostly devoid of meaning. I mean in the truest sense of the word—that which causes awe. I imagine if you have spent any time in this book, you know precisely what I'm getting at.

The astonishing, and at times terrifyingly strange images and creatures portrayed in Revelation, (and other apocalyptic portions of the Word), attempt to give us a small glimpse of the Heavenly realm, things which are largely indescribable and beyond our ability to even put into words. In them we see the greatness and the glory of the Lord, and we recognize that He is "other."

The living creatures here, as in **Isaiah 6**, repeat "holy" three times to emphasize the perfect and complete holiness of the Lord. His holiness is inseparable from the essence of his being. He. Is. Holy. There is no ambiguity here concerning His divine purity or perfection.

Concerning Jesus, John writes,

"...and in the midst of the lampstands one like a son of man, clothed with a long robe and with a golden sash around his chest. The hairs of his head were white, like white wool, like snow. His eyes were like a flame of fire, his feet were like burnished bronze, refined in a furnace, and his voice was like the roar of many waters. In his right hand he held seven stars, from his mouth came a sharp two-edged sword, and his face was like the sun shining in full strength.

When I saw him, I fell at his feet as though dead. But he laid his right hand on me, saying, 'Fear not, I am the first and the last, and the living one. I died, and behold I am alive forevermore, and I have the keys of Death and Hades'" Revelation 1:13-18.

You may need a deep breath (or two) after reading that passage. Wow!

We see Jesus Christ in full majesty and resplendent glory. The brightness of his face is as the full sun. He is exceedingly beyond the merely physical and natural. He exists apart from and above the material universe, outside of space and time itself. He is transcendent.

But why is it so important that we see and understand His holiness and His transcendence?

Because we see that He is worthy of all praise and glory. And that drives us to worship Him, and it changes us. Our response should be like John when he says, "When I saw him, I fell at his feet as though dead." The living creatures near the throne never cease to cry out praise because they are in His presence.

Yet, in this vision when John fell at Christ's feet as though dead, Jesus put His right hand on him and told him to fear not, reminding John that He has conquered death. Jesus, sovereign over all things, of the same essence as His Father, condescended to redeem His creation. He came to pay the debt for our sin. Our Lord, though holy and transcendent, is not far from those who call upon Him.

How great and awesome is this grace given that we might be saved and inherited eternal life, freely given to those that believe by faith, though at an uncountable cost to the King. He deserves all praise and glory forever.


