Pastoral Pondering

Our Perfect Father

"The steadfast love of the Lord never ceases; his mercies never come to an end; they are new every morning; great is your faithfulness." Lamentations 3: 22-23.

In most cases in Life, the more you do something the better you get at it. For instance, the more you practice a musical instrument the better you get at it. The same goes for sports and even with occupations, but when it comes to parenting, the principle doesn't necessarily seem to hold up!

As a grandparent raising a grandson, I am once again reminded of the difficulties of raising children. Cory and I have the blessing of having a grandson who has lived with us since his birth. Out of necessity and love, I have assumed the role of a father. Most of the time this has been a blessing, but with blessings come trials. My grandson was diagnosed with Type 1 diabetes 3 years ago which turned our world upside down, even as a former physician. Meals are now accompanied by label reading, calculating carbs and insulin injections. Many are the nights we are awakened by alarms going off signaling either elevated blood sugars requiring insulin or low blood sugars requiring candy or such to raise his glucose. Nights have been spent monitoring blood sugars until they stabilize before finally being able to go to sleep.

As a parent/grandparent, I wish I could trade places with him, allowing him to return to the prediabetes days where life was carefree without insulin shots and alarms. Despite all of this, life with diabetes goes on. My grandson loves dirt biking and is involved in racing. He and I spend a lot of time together at tracks and races which I love. I personally have never been involved in racing in the past, but let me say there is stress involved, and not only from accidents and injuries. For example, recently I was trying to get his bike started but, due to the cold, I had a hard time starting it. As his friends were all leaving on their bikes, I continued trying to kickstart his cold bike only to have it sputter and die over and over again. Each time he'd shake his head and mutter something that I couldn't hear given the noise of the motors on the track. I finally lost my cool and raised by voice and said some not too kind of words, which were immediately received poorly, causing him to walk out to the truck. I was left standing on the track all alone to contemplate the hurtful words I had spewed. I went out to the truck and found him broken and sobbing. I had failed miserably as a parent.

I apologized profusely and told him how much I loved him and that I was truly sorry for my behavior. He told me all he was trying to say was to make sure I had the choke on. He wasn't being critical of me, which is how I'd taken his headshaking and mumbling! Writing about the moment now still makes my heart ache. This was not my finest hour as a parent!

I clearly realize that I still haven't mastered parenting even at the age of 67. I would have thought by now I could remain calm and cool during the trials of parenting, but I fail far too often, which I'm not proud to admit. Perhaps this is why people say it takes a village to raise a child. When one person fails, the next person steps up.

My failures as a veteran parent point out that as followers of Jesus, we have a perfect Father who knows our heartaches including our health afflictions like cancer and diabetes, our financial problems and marriage issues. He never sleeps; He monitors our conditions continuously. His love is steadfast, unwavering and resolute, and His mercies are unending. He never forsakes us and remains by our side in both good times and bad times. He loves us so much that he sent his only Son to die for our sins so that we may be called children of God! That's the good news that we should be shouting from Dresser to Nepal!

Writing this pondering as the appointed Archbishop of Dresser has been cathartic in that I have confessed to all of you that I often fall short, but I vow that I'll continue to pursue Jesus and pray that all of you will do the same. In doing so we'll be known by our Love and not our shortcomings.
