Pastoral Pondering

When Doing Evil Is The Only Option

Have you ever found yourself in a situation where it seemed there was only one possible course of action and you knew that course of action was wrong, sinful, or even downright evil? You are not alone in that experience. Herod Agrippa had a complicated relationship with John the Baptist. Mark 6:14-28 describes the tragic day of Herod's birthday party: his wife's daughter danced; Herod made a rash promise; the girl responded to the promise; and finally, John was tragically killed. There is a lot to unpack in this passage, but I would like to focus on just one element. Interestingly, while this element is very important, it does not appear in the text at all! To address a matter that is not in the text seems foolish as an "addition" to the scriptural account. Yet it will become obvious that the element is very important, and reveals something about Herod Agrippa and others, including you and me.

Herod had taken Herodias, his brother Phillip's wife, as his wife. John the Baptist boldly challenged him over this adulterous action, so Herodias wanted the innocent man of God dead (v. 19). Herod feared John but at the same time enjoyed conversations with him (v. 20). This kept John alive. For a time.

A birthday party for Herod produced an opportunity that Herodias would use to do away with John. Her daughter danced before Herod and his party guests, and all were profoundly impressed. Herod's pleasure in the dance was so great that he made a rash vow: he would give the girl anything she asked for. Mark includes the full text of the promise to emphasize the extent of it:

Ask me for whatever you wish, and I will give it to you. And he vowed to her, "Whatever you ask me, I will give you, up to half of my kingdom" (vv. 22b, 23.)

It was a "blank check" that would thrill the heart of any young person. What would she ask for? Half of the kingdom? A million dollars? A handsome and wealthy husband? The girl was so overwhelmed by the immensity of the possibilities that she asked her mother for advice. Her mother simply expressed *her* own heart's desire: "The head of John the Baptist." (v 24b) The girl returned to Herod with the request.

Herod's response should chill us to the core of our being:

And the king was exceedingly sorry, but because of \underline{his} oaths and \underline{his} guests he did not want to break his word to her (v. 26.)

The missing element in this story is found in the fact that Herod did not consider the *obvious choice* which he *should* have made. He should have said something like, "Honey, you should know that's *not* what I had in mind with my promise. Think of something you know I can and will do. How about your own chariot and horses to go with it?" But Herod did not do that because "a promise is a promise" and because he feared what his guests would think if he failed to keep his vow. He fell victim to the fear of man.

The fear of man lays a snare, but whoever trusts in the LORD is safe. (Proverbs 29:25)

Herod fell victim to the snare. He thought he had locked himself into this promise he made because of what his guests would think. He had failed to anticipate that the girl might make a foolish request. His rash promise forced him into a situation that caused him not to consider the obvious option of doing what was right. He failed to be a man of integrity. The result was his responsibility for the death of a man sent by God. Herod missed doing the right thing.

This is the very situation we sometimes find ourselves in. We rashly contemplate doing something sinful, and what we *should* have done never occurs to us until it is too late.

When we find ourselves in what seems to be an impossible situation, we need to draw upon the wisdom and direction of God to do what is right rather than what is expedient—especially if it seems there is only one evil option. To do what is right, we need to be faithfully immersed in God's word daily and living a life that is obedient to His word.

The pressures we put upon ourselves and the opinions of people around us are not good guides and they do not lead to wisdom or pleasing God.


