# **Pastoral Pondering**

# Comfort Ye, Comfort Ye My People!

(1) Comfort, comfort my people, says your God. (2) Speak tenderly to Jerusalem, and cry to her that her warfare is ended, that her iniquity is pardoned, that she has received from the LORD's hand double for all her sins. (3) A voice cries: 'In the wilderness prepare the way of the LORD; make straight in the desert a highway for our God. (4) Every valley shall be lifted up, and every mountain and hill be made low; the uneven ground shall become level, and the rough places a plain. (5) And the glory of the LORD shall be revealed, and all flesh shall see it together, for the mouth of the LORD has spoken."

- Isaiah 40:1-5

This passage of Scripture often reminds me of George Friderick Handel's famous musical oratorio, *Messiah*. The lyrics are entirely taken from the Scriptures - 42 Old and New Testament passages. These were compiled by a friend of his in order to musically convey the biblical gospel message focusing on the promised Messiah and the fulfillment in Jesus Christ: His life, death, resurrection and glorification. The 2nd, 3rd and 4th movements are settings of Isaiah 40:1-5 which bring back many fond Christmas-season memories of hearing my father walking around the house singing the 2nd movement, "Comfort ye, comfort ye my people, saith your God." Those words seem to grow richer with every passing year.

In context though, this text arrives at an odd time in the book of Isaiah. Isaiah 39 ends with God telling king Hezekiah that judgement and Babylonian captivity are coming for his descendants and Israel. Such despairing news, but then immediately, these words of comfort from God for His people! God brought these words at this time in order to console/comfort His people, who I imagine were distraught at hearing of the coming judgement that was to fall upon them, knowing they were an unfaithful, failing and rebellious people. Verse 2, God intends to speak tenderly/lovingly the news that her sins are atoned for in full. This is blood sacrifice language, but notice that this sacrifice has been provided for by God Himself for His people and their sin. (This "double" means a perfect this-for-that sins to punishment ratio).

Verse 3 begins with a familiar line that John the Baptist quotes of himself in John 1:23, a voice crying out in the wilderness. This 'voice' should similarly be taken as 'listen!' for those hearing the proclamation. It also has to be seen in these next verses that although the condemnation was for one nation, Israel, the comfort that is heralded will be for all the nations! This includes you. The desert highway that is spoken of is a reference back to God journeying to His people who were in Egypt (Deuteronomy 33:2) in order to rescue them. All of the obstacles that will be made straight in verse 4 tie into this road, explaining to us that there would be no hinderance - nothing could prevent God's arrival

and the deliverance of His people!

Verse 5 is one of the greatest promises of the Old Testament directly from the mouth of the LORD! The LORD's glory here is His presence (e.g. Exodus 16:10) which would be revealed to all mankind! The promised Messiah, Emmanuel, did arrive. Christ Jesus. God's Word, again, proving true. "And the Word became flesh and dwelt among us, and we have seen his glory, glory as of the only Son from the Father, full of grace and truth." (John 1:14)

May our Lord stir in us an even deeper awe and joy as we ponder His plan in saving His people.


## This Sunday's Worship Songs:
