Pastoral Pondering

Perspective

"So we do not lose heart. Though our outer self is wasting away, our inner self is being renewed day by day. For this light momentary affliction is preparing for us an eternal weight of glory beyond all comparison, as we look not to the things that are seen but to the things that are unseen. For the things that are seen are transient, but the things that are unseen are eternal."--- 2 Corinthians 4:16-18

For many Christians this is a favorite passage to reflect on, especially during times when what we see with our eyes challenges what we know to be true according to God's Word. What we see and feel are powerful influencers for the state of our hearts and minds. So we need the reminders of God's Word in the midst of the trials, hardships, and temptations to give us the eternal perspective during the days of our sojourning here until the day our Savior comes again.

Earlier in chapter 4 Paul has been describing the ministry of the gospel given to believers by the mercy of God (vs 1). The way this gospel is manifested in the life of the believers is that they begin, as servants of God, proclaiming Christ and no longer themselves (vs. 5). This gospel, this treasure, this life and light of Christ has been deposited in the believer who is described as a jar of clay (vs. 7). Paul describes the physical experience of those ministering this gospel with words more than just a little uncomfortable, such as: "afflicted, perplexed, persecuted, struck down, and always carrying in the body the death of Jesus." Though this is true, they are somehow not crushed, not driven to despair, not forsaken, not destroyed, and not dead (vs. 8-12). What is happening here? Paul describes what appears like two different realities. On the one hand he describes the experience in the flesh is like being given over to death daily, yet on the other hand, simultaneously, there is a sustaining grace of God that is at work inside the heart and soul of the believer, preparing them for eternal things of incomparable glory.

Now when he starts vs. 16 with, "So we do not lose heart, though our outer self is wasting away..." We kind of get why someone might be tempted to lose heart. Dying daily is not pleasant by any means. If Paul and those with him or if we ourselves would look only with physical eyes at our physical experiences to make sense of life or to ground our joy and hope in, we would be certainly driven to despair and crushed. But through this, another reality is taking place within, "our inner self is being renewed day by day."

He acknowledges that there is real affliction and real hardship that has powerful sway on our minds and perspective, yet he tells us that from God's eternal perspective this

affliction is preparing us for glory! And when you compare your current affliction to the weight of eternal glory, all things, no matter how severe, will soon appear light and momentary. We need not our circumstances to change to grow in faith, hope, love, and joy; we need our inner self renewed day by day with God's eternal perspective and purposes for us in Christ.

Where does Paul point our eyes? To Christ and His current sanctifying work, His sure future promises, and the eternal glory we will share with Him. This is where we need to keep our eyes too. Paul and those with him are looking NOT to the things that are seen (current temporary afflictions) but to the things that are unseen (future eternal glory) as they walk out the ministry of the gospel. "For the things that are seen are transient but the things that are unseen are eternal." Living with your eyes on Christ does not ignore the present affliction but by faith recognizes what we experience here and now, is actually His very means of preparing us for the eternal weight of coming glory beyond all comparison.

Remember beloved family in the Lord, we are called to labor in the ministry of the Spirit that brings true life by proclaiming Christ and His gospel. Though, "we who live are always being given over to death for Jesus' sake, it is so that the life of Jesus also may be manifested in our mortal flesh." There is a real, daily dying to ourselves and real struggle and affliction, but take heart; it is God's means to prepare us for what is incomparably better, things that are eternal and full of glory. With Paul, we are to keep our eyes on the truth and promises of Scripture, keeping our eyes on the glory of God in the face of Jesus Christ.
