The Process of Forgiveness 2

[Process of Forgiveness]

Forgiveness (Greek: Aphesis) – To pardon, to free, to release of **DEBT**

1. Releases debt to God.

(Matthew 18:21-35; Matthew 6:9-13; Acts 7:59-60)

2. Releases people to God and His righteous judgment.

(Vengeance is God's – Genesis 4:15; Romans12:19)

- 3. Forgiveness <u>releases me</u> from being held hostage by <u>tormentors</u> (Matthew 18:34) (Resentment, anger, bitterness, offense, grudges, malice...)
- 4. Forgiveness shows and sows mercy

Luke 6:36...Being merciful as our Father is merciful.

Micah 7:18 – "Who is God like you, pardoning iniquity and passing over the remnant of His heritage? He does not retain His anger forever, because He **delights** in **mercy**."

5. Forgiveness <u>restores love</u> – Luke 7:36-49 (ref)

A certain creditor who had two debtors (\$5 and \$50 000) The creditor forgave both debts Which will love <u>more</u>! (vs. 47)

Vs. 47 (NKJV) — "Therefore I say to you, her sins, which are many, are forgiven, for she loved much. But to whom little is forgiven, the same loves little."

6. Forgiveness releases healing. – 2 Chronicles 7:14 (NKJV)

When we forgive, the healing of hurts and pains can begin.

7. Forgiveness is **limitless**

Luke 17:1-5 (NKJV)

Matthew 18:21-22 (ref)

7x70 times in forgiveness

There is no "3 strikes and you are out"

There's not 7 either

[It is reconciliation not forgiveness that is limited.]

Luke 17:3 (NKJV)

- Wrong committed
- Wrong confronted
- Wrong repented of -?
- Wrong forgiven

[Forgiveness is not dependent on reconciliation (trust)]

What if there is no repentance (reconciliation)?

- Drug and alcohol abuse
- Habitual infidelity
- Physical or child abuse

Take Away

- 1. I choose to forgive...period. (Limitless)
- 2. The process of healing and freedom are mine regardless of others responses.
