Revelation and Daniel

The Seven Dispensations

1 - Innocence

<u>Time element</u> – From the creation of Adam and Eve in Genesis 2 until the fall in Genesis 3

<u>Test</u> – Genesis 2:17, "...from the tree of the knowledge of good and evil you shall not eat..."

Failure - They ate of the tree, Genesis 3:6

<u>Judgment</u> – Genesis 1:17, "...in the day that you eat from it you shall surely die."

2 - Conscience

Time element - From the fall to the flood

<u>Test</u> – Respond to God through the promptings of his conscience.

<u>Failure</u> – Cain slew Abel, Genesis 4:8, unnatural affection became rampant, Genesis 6:1-5

Judgment - The flood, Genesis 7

3 - Human Government

<u>Time element</u> – From the flood, Genesis 8:20, to the call of Abraham in Genesis 12

Test – Govern righteously and fill the earth, Genesis 9:1-7

Failure – Instead of governing and filling the earth they remained together and built a tower to themselves, Genesis 11:4

<u>Judgment</u> – The confusion of language, Genesis 11:7

4 - Promise

<u>Time element</u> – The call of Abraham, Genesis 12, to the giving of the Law, Exodus 19

<u>Test</u> – To believe the promise of God and serve Him

<u>Failure</u> – They left the promised land and went to Egypt <u>Judgment</u> – Slavery in Egypt

- Law

5 - Law

<u>Time element</u> – The giving of the Law, Exodus 19, to the death of Christ and the beginning of the church in Acts 2

Test - Keep the Law

Failure – Repeated idolatry and failure to keep the Law Judgment – The Assyrian and Babylonian captivity and eventual worldwide dispersion

6 - Grace (Church)

<u>Time element</u> – The beginning of the church, Acts 2, to the rapture of the church, 1 Thessalonians 4:13-18 (the 7 years of tribulation fall at the end of this period).

<u>Test</u> – Accept the gift of righteousness that God offers freely to all

<u>Failure</u> – Rejection of God's grace in Jesus Christ Judgment – Unbelievers in the tribulation

7 - Millennium

<u>Time element</u> – The second coming of Christ to the end of the millennium, Revelation 20

Test – Obedience to the King

Failure – Rebellion and attack on the King, Revelation 20:7-9

Judgment – Destruction by fire from heaven and the Great

White Throne, Revelation 20:9-15

The Seven Dispensations are NOT seven ways of salvation. Salvation is always by FAITH!

"Without faith it is impossible to please Him..." Hebrews 11:6

Two classes of covenants are given in Scripture:

Conditional – A covenant that guarantees God will do His part when the human requirements stipulated in the covenant are met.

- 1. Edenic Covenant Genesis 1:26-31, 2:16-17
- 2. Mosaic Exodus 20:1 31:18

Unconditional – A covenant that is guaranteed by God and will be fulfilled because of His power and sovereignty regardless of human actions.

- 1. Adamic Genesis 3:16-19
- 2. Noahic Genesis 9:1-18
- 3. Abrahamic Genesis 12:1-4, 13:14-17, 15:1-7, 17:1-8
- 4. Land (Palestinian) Deuteronomy 30:1-10
- 5. Davidic 2 Samuel 7:4-16, 1 Chronicles 17:3-15
- 6. New Jeremiah 31:31-34

Abraham Is Promised – Unconditionally:

- A land
- To be the father of a great nation
- Personal blessings
- A great name
- To be a blessing (or curse) to all mankind

The promise is reiterated in Genesis 13:14-17

The covenant is ratified in Genesis 15:17-21

The covenant promises are declared to be everlasting in Genesis 17:4-9
